Report

It is proposed that Friday 13th July 2001 be declared a public holiday in order to mark the occasion of the visit of Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness The Prince Philip.

The appropriate legislation has been drafted and, in accordance with Standing Order 18A of the Standing Orders of the States of Jersey regarding manpower and financial implications, the Legislation Committee would comment as follows -

- (a) there are no manpower implications other than the increased cost of overtime and premium payments applicable for working on a public holiday; and,
- (b) the comments of the Finance and Economics Committee are to follow.

Explanatory Note

This Act provides for Friday 13th July to be an additional public holiday in 2001.
