The department had been informed The advisers' role would be to focus primarily on the proposition, and not extend to detailed study of amendments or other aspects Draft questions previously discussed had been sent to the department There had been a positive initial response to the JEP adverts and numerous submissions had been received. It was agreed there was no need to place a radio advert with Channel 103 Possible dates for public hearings were discussed. Members were advised that a hearing later than the second week of March would not allow the report to be finished in time for the debate owing to requirements for the stakeholder version to be with the department for 5 working days. 4th and 7th March were suggested as possible dates. Members asked that Working Group representatives be present for the hearing - it was felt this would be for the Minister to arrange. 	be sympathetic to this, it was considered that the Panel would need to produce a strong report focusing on the current lack of evidence and inconsistencies in the department's case, so that if the matter still went to debate on 5 th April States Members would be in no doubt that the proposition needed more work.
