REPORT

The Maincrop Potato Marketing Scheme was introduced in 1968, when many growers produced maincrop potatoes for local sale. In order to regulate supply, a Board was established in a bid to control the areas grown so that growers could ensure a fair return from the marketplace. The local market is now self-regulating and the current growers of maincrop potatoes consider the Scheme to be no longer necessary.

There are no financial or manpower implications for the States arising from the adoption of this draft Act.

Explanatory Note

This Act would revoke the Maincrop Potato Marketing Scheme 1968 on the seventh day after the making of the Act.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Article 7(2) of the Agricultural Marketing (Jersey) Law $1953^{[1]}$ have made the following Act –

1 Revocation of Scheme

The Maincrop Potato Marketing Scheme 1968^[2] shall be revoked on the seventh day after the making of this Act.

This Act may be cited as the Maincrop Potato Marketing Scheme (Revocation) (Jersey) Act 200.
