515/34	Members discussed the need to frame the review in a way which would not lead to unfair criticism of the company. It was agreed that a review was required due to the level of public interest in this matter, but it might be difficult to ensure balance when seeking submissions from the general public, as those who had experienced difficulties when travelling would be more likely to respond than others who may have been satisfied by the service received. Members considered that the focus could be somewhat wider, looking at departmental input into service levels and conditions agreed under the extended contract, and whether these were appropriate to the needs of the travelling public. The change of emphasis would need to be reflected in amendments to the draft scoping document. It was suggested that the Scrutiny Officer approach the Ports of Jersey	

	for an initial discussion regarding possible terms of reference, which could be followed by a meeting between the Panel and the Group Chief Executive Officer if desired.	МО
