R&O.121/2017.

Road Traffic (St. Helier) (Amendment No. 33) (Jersey) Order 2017.

This Order amends the Road Traffic (St. Helier) (Jersey) Order 1996 ("principal Order") to make provision to allow internet payments for parking charges on public roads in St. Helier as an alternative to purchase of pay cards.

Article 1 is an interpretation provision.

Articles 2 to 7 insert a definition of "valid remote payment" in the principal Order and makes consequential amendments to the Order to allow internet payments for parking charges. It also makes provision for a digital photograph to be used as evidence of a vehicle parked at a parking place and for a printed copy of records held by the Minister for Infrastructure of valid remote payments to be prima facie evidence of whether or not a valid remote payment has been made.

Article 8 sets out the title of the Order and provides for its commencement.

The Order was made on 20th November 2017 and came into force on 27th November 2017.

Will the Minister release any minutes or papers to support his assertion in paragraph (c) of his written answer that the Council of Ministers had agreed funding for the creation of the Park?

Is it the case that there was no agreement between the Parish and Infrastructure over the removal of funding for rising bollards in Robin Place as recorded in the exchange of emails on 27/09/2011 and 04/11/2011?

What justification, if any, was given for the decision made in December 2012 to repay contingency funding of £500,000 despite the failure to agree Tunnell Street access with the Parish?"
