- (d) the number of retrospective planning applications that were made to the department;
- (e) the number of such retrospective applications that were granted approval on the first attempt;
- (f) the number of such retrospective applications that were granted approved on the second attempt and, if there were applications subject to multiple attempts at approval, the number of applications granted approval on the third attempt, fourth attempt and so on; and
- (g) the number of planning officers who dealt with applications in each year?
