 It was noted that the H3 Affordable Housing policy had now been abandoned so would no longer be included; The Panel noted that a review of heritage policy should take place in the New Year following the planned review of radon The Minister for Planning and Environment had now committed to releasing a Green Paper on Planning Appeals by the end of 2012; Members agreed that as Ministers appeared to have taken up the matter of asbestos disposal the Panel should simply monitor the situation for the time being; The Panel discussed possibilities for a wider review of solid waste recycling activities, perhaps to take place in May/June 2013. It was felt that there was a need for public land to be released for the use of private sector companies engaged in recycling; There was some discussion of a possible need for a review of Building Bye Laws in respect of energy use issues under the draft Energy Policy. 	10
