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REPORT

The fishery for ormers is due to be opened this autumn. To provide greater security for the ormer stock by allowing a longer period for an ormer to spawn before being caught, this legislation raises the minimum size from 80 mm to 90 mm.

Financial and manpower implications

These Regulations have no additional financial or manpower implications for the resources of the States.

Explanatory Note

These Regulations increase from 8 centimetres to 9 centimetres the minimum size of ormers, when measured across the broadest part of the shell, that may be taken.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Articles 2, 6 and 8 of the Sea Fisheries (Jersey) Law 1994,^[1] having consulted with the Secretary of State and obtained the Secretary's concurrence, have made the following Regulations -

1. In Column 2 of Part 3 of the Schedule to the Sea Fisheries (Minimum Size Limits) (Jersey) Regulations 2001^[2] in the item relating to Ormer (*Haliotis tuberculata*) for "8 centimetres" there shall be substitute "9 centimetres".

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Sea Fisheries (Minimum Size Limits) (Amendment) (Jersey) Regulations 200- and shall come into force on promulgation.
