## WRITTEN QUESTION TO THE MINISTER FOR CHILDREN AND EDUCATION BY THE CONNÉTABLE OF ST. JOHN QUESTION SUBMITTED ON MONDAY 6<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2021 ANSWER TO BE TABLED ON MONDAY 13<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2021

## Question

Has there been any reduction in the Children's Social Care budget over the last 2 years and, if so, will the Minister explain how such a budget reduction is consistent with the Government's promise to provide safe, stable and loving homes for children in care?

## Answer

Since 2019, the budget held by the Director of Safeguarding and Care has increased by £9 million, from  $\pounds 20,158,755$  to  $\pounds 29,184,134$ .  $\pounds 3,345,934$  was transferred out of the budget to support other services in CYPES.

 $\pounds 2,704,200$  has been taken out in efficiencies and in our drive to provide better value for money – for example, there has been a reduction in spend on off-Island placements as we have worked hard to enable children in the care of the minister to be supported in Jersey. That gives a final budget of  $\pounds 23,134,000$ . The saving as a percentage of the closing budget 2021 is 12%.

Put simply, the budget available to safeguard and care for children and young people has increased overall, from  $\pounds 20,158,755$  to  $\pounds 23,134,000$  and the money available is being used more effectively and efficiently. This is very much in keeping with our commitment to Put Children First.
