Social Security Scheme: amendments P.117/2010

THE STATES commenced consideration of a proposition of Senator Alan Breckon entitled 'Social Security Scheme: amendments' (P.117/2010) and rejected paragraph 1, that in order to provide for long-term care –

- (a) a Long-Term Care Insurance Fund should be established broadly based on the system in operation in Guernsey since 2002, (attached at Appendix 1) but extended in Jersey to provide for home care;
- (b) the Long Term Care Insurance Fund should be funded by increasing Social Security Contributions by 1% from both the employer and the employee in January 2012 and annually thereafter;

- (c) money raised in paragraph (1)(b) above should be hypothecated (ring-fenced) for the provision of a Long-Term Care Insurance Fund;
- (d) those in retirement, above an agreed financial threshold, should contribute on a regular basis to the Long-Term Care Insurance Fund on a basis to be proposed by the Minister for Social Security;
- (e) the States would pay the contributions of those of limited means or below an agreed income and means threshold;
- (f) no benefits would be paid from the Long-Term Care Insurance Fund until July 2012 in order to build a reserve equivalent to 6 months' contributions.
