JT Group Limited: restructuring of enterprise P.96/2017

THE STATES commenced consideration of a proposition of Senator Sarah Craig Ferguson entitled ‘JT Group Limited: restructuring of enterprise’ (P.96/2017) and, adopting an amendment of Senator Sarah Craig Ferguson (P.96/2017 Amd.), agreed that for paragraph (c) there should be substituted the following –

- “(c) to request the Chief Minister to use the telecommunications strategy detailed in the attached schedule as a foundation for developing a States telecommunications strategy;
- (d) to request the Minister for Treasury and Resources, as shareholder representative, to request the board of JT Group Ltd. to conduct a detailed review of the off-Island businesses controlled by Jersey Telecom to evaluate their long-term benefit to the company.”.

- (c) to request the Chief Minister to use the telecommunications strategy detailed in the attached schedule as a foundation for developing a States telecommunications strategy; and
- (d) to request the Minister for Treasury and Resources, as shareholder representative, to request the board of JT Group Ltd. to conduct a detailed review of the off-Island businesses controlled by Jersey Telecom to evaluate their long-term benefit to the company.
