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REPORT

The Shops (Regulation of Opening and Deliveries) (Jersey) Law 2010 outlines a new system for the management of Sunday trading and was approved by the States on 4th November 2009. This Law allows the States to make subordinate legislation in the form of Regulations containing the detail of the new scheme.

Those Regulations (the Shops (Regulation of Opening) (Jersey) Regulations 201-) cannot operate without the primary Law, and so this Appointed Day Act will bring the Shops (Regulation of Opening and Deliveries) (Jersey) Law 2010 into force.

This will complete the process and bring the new Sunday trading permit scheme into effect.

If this Act is approved, the Shops (Regulation of Opening and Deliveries) (Jersey) Law 2010 will come into force 14 days after that approval.

Financial and manpower implications

There are no additional financial or manpower implications for the States arising from the adoption of this Draft Appointed Day Act.

Explanatory Note

This Act will bring the Shops (Regulation of Opening and Deliveries) (Jersey) Law 2010 into force 14 days after the Act is made.

1 Law commenced

The Shops (Regulation of Opening and Deliveries) (Jersey) Law 2010² shall come into force 14 days after this Act is made.

This Act may be cited as the Shops (Regulation of Opening and Deliveries) (Jersey) Law 2010 (Appointed Day) Act 201-.
