Hallo Roy - one or two ideas re the planning process -

As well as the normal notices in the JEP, full details of applications should be available in the parish hall of the relevant parish, and the Constables should notify all the adjacent property owners. When a proposed development is close to a parish boundary, then both Constables should have the details of the application.

A notice/s should be put up on the site for passers-by to see.

The time allowed by Planning for submissions on proposed developments should be extended to at least 3 weeks in case owners are out of the island, ill, etc.

Page 36 of Clothier, re an ombudsman. 9.4 '...the power of compulsion should lie in the States, to whom the Ombudsman reports and whose officer he is. ...'. Since we don't have an ombudsman, findings/recommendations of the Review Board in planning matters should be debated and voted on by the whole assembly - in the past Planning Committees have sometimes ignored the Board's recommendations when the States as a whole might have wished to comply.
