

End of June 23 Short commentary update

Widening the eligbility criteria for the Assisted Purchase Home Ownership Scheme, acknlowledging the affordability challenges and responding to the aspirations of Islanders who want to own their home. Public consultation on proposed changes to the Residential Tenancy Law, which included working with Citizens Advice and Caritas. Listened to Islanders impacted by high rent increase imposed by Jersey Homes Trust, intervening to delay the increases.
Actively engaged with States Members by holding an In-Committee debate on proposals for the Residential Tenancy Law, as well as proactively engaging with interested States Members (such as parishes with housing schemes). Plans to refine the focus of the Strategic Housing Partnership, whilst ensuring invaluable industry expertise is adequately harnessed.
Income thresholds updated for Assisted Purchase Home Ownership Scheme have been published (July 2023), allowing more Islanders to access help to buy a home. A Ministerial Steering Group has been established to support the development of proposals for a scheme using the £10m set-aside to assit Islanders with home ownership. Preferred options to be announced in September.
The public consultation on proposals to update the Residential Tenancy Law ran from 14 April to 23 June. Law drafting resource will be made available to progress the law drafting instructions in July.
As above.

The proposed residential tenancy reforms include provision for secondary legislation-making powers to establish a statutory definition of homelessness and arrangements for homelessness services. The Housing Advice Service is continuing to expand with a particular focus on increasing resources and capacity to support individuals with complex needs, and to strengthen multi-agency working. New forms of housing-led support are being piloted by the HAS in collaboration with a number of housing providers to ensure that the right accommodation and support arrangements are in place to meet the needs of individuals with complex and multiple needs who are vulnerable to insecure housing situations. Continuing commitment to delivering fair and sustainable changes to the Gateway eligibility criteria so that even more Islanders in housing need can access social housing.

Housing Delivery Ministerial Partnership formed to improve inter-ministerial coordination and partnership on matters relating to housing delivery.

The housing team has been under-resourced for the last decade. Now with more stability in the team, this work will be able to progress later in the year.

Around 150 complaince short-term holiday-let cases were referred to the Infrastructure and Environment Regulation Directorate for investigation and action. A focus has been placed on entire homes which represent a loss of housing stock.

The Empty Homes Service was launched in January 2023, leading to circa 250 empty homes being reported to the service using the online webform.


The Empty Homes Service was launched in January 2023, leading to circa 250 empty homes being reported to the service using the online webform and a number of Islanders contacting the service for advice and support to bring their empty home back into use.

Inserts were issued with Rates declarations by all Parishes. A total of 370 forms were returned.

Work is continuing to undertand the potential role of the Rates system in identifying and reporting empty homes in Jersey. Liason will continue with the Comite des Connetables.

The housing team has been under resourced for the last decade. Now with more stability in the team, this work will be able to progress later in the year.

Income criteria update was implemented at the beginning of the year. Further details on plans to reduce the age of eligiblity will be brought to the Council of Minister in July.
Working in partnership with Andium Homes.
Work is well under way to address the prioirty data intelligence needs (planning data) and the team is continuing liasion with Statistics Jersey and the Economics unit to identify and resolve data requirements.
Work has begun on developing the scope of the strategy, which will look at tackling housing challenges in the longer term.
