<b>1. Records of Meetings</b>  The Panel approved the records of its meetings for 3 <sup>rd</sup> , 5 <sup>th</sup> , 12 <sup>th</sup> and 13 <sup>th</sup> December 2024.	<b>JH</b>
<b>2. Work Programme</b>  The Panel discussed its work programme for 2025 and noted the upcoming draft legislation within its remit, as identified in a letter received by the Scrutiny Liaison Committee from the Chief Minister. It acknowledged that the legislative programme would largely preoccupy the Panel's work for the year.  The Panel reflected on the debate of the Draft Shipping (Registration) (Jersey) Amendment Regulations 202-. [P.46/2024] and how correspondence to the Assembly had created political discourse in a short timeframe. The Panel confirmed with the Officer the formalised process for scrutinising legislation. The Panel expressed the need to adopt a more proactive stance on publication of Comments Papers outlining the scrutiny undertaken in its consideration of legislation and agreed that it would comment on all workstreams within the legislative programme for 2025 as and when it felt it suitable, whilst being mindful of its workload and resources.  The Panel further discussed the Shipping (Registration) (Jersey) Amendment Regulations 2024 and agreed to include the matter as an area for questioning during its quarterly hearing with the Minister for Sustainable Economic Development scheduled for 20 <sup>th</sup> February 2025.  The Panel discussed the potential meeting with Deputy Sam Mézec on the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership but agreed it was not necessary at that time.  The Panel then considered potential reviews or areas of questioning supplementary to the legislative programme.  The ferry tender process was identified as an area for further exploration. The Panel noted an overlap with the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) and Comptroller and Auditor General, which were examining procurement processes, the administration of Government and transport links and agreed to stay informed on their work to avoid duplication. The Panel discussed the economic impact of the tender process,	<b>PL/JH</b>          <b>PL</b>

<p>including costs to the economy and the connection between economic value and reputational risk. It was noted that these elements fell under the Panel's remit. Accordingly, the Panel agreed that further consideration was required of how to best pose questions to the Minister for Sustainable Economic Development on the matter and agreed that this would be discussed at a future meeting. The Panel also agreed to draft a statement regarding the matter stating its intention to scrutinise the topic and announcing its intention to continue questioning the Minister for Sustainable Development.</p> <p>The Panel discussed staffing issues within the Economy Department and agreed to include this as an area for questioning within its quarterly hearing with the Minister for Sustainable Economic Development scheduled for 20<sup>th</sup> February 2025.</p> <p>The Panel discussed its ongoing Review of Acceptance of Cash Payments and noted that the draft report would shortly be forwarded for its consideration.</p> <p>The Panel noted that the cost of living had been highlighted as a potential area of public interest for scrutiny review. The Panel discussed the potential for a focused review to consider elements of the workstream that fell within its remit and considered forming a sub-panel.
