PAGE 14, REGULATION 7(f) -

*For the words* a member of the Honorary Police or of the Force, who shall not be *substitute the words* any person,  
other than

PAGE 15, REGULATION 11 -

*Omit the paragraph numbering* (1)

*Omit paragraph* (2).

PAGE 16, REGULATION 13 -

*For paragraph* (2) *substitute the following paragraph* -

(2) The Attorney General shall give the member concerned, at the same time as he gives notice pursuant to paragraph (1), written notice of the right of the member concerned to be represented by any person at the hearing.

PAGE 17, REGULATION 14 -

*For paragraph (1)(b) substitute the following sub-paragraph -*

(b) whether and by whom he intends to be represented at the disciplinary hearing; and

PAGE 18, REGULATION 15 -

*In paragraph (b) for the words elect to be legally substitute the words intend to be*

PAGE 18, REGULATION 18 -

*For Regulation 18 substitute the following Regulation -*

**Representation at disciplinary hearing**

(1) The member concerned may conduct his case in person or may be represented by any person.

(2) The case against the member concerned shall be presented by a member of the Force, an advocate or a solicitor.

PAGE 21, REGULATION 22 -

*For paragraph (4) substitute the following paragraph -*

(4) The member concerned may be accompanied at the hearing by any person other than an interested party.

## **Report**

I appreciate that the Regulations suggested by the Home Affairs Committee in P.159/2000 are intended to assist Honorary Police Officers who are complained of. However, I feel that the right bestowed upon officers for assistance in the suggested form is too prescriptive. The purpose of my amendments is to allow members of the Honorary Police to be represented by persons of their choice, irrespective of that person's background or qualifications.
