CCTV Camera Surveillance</b></p> <p>The Panel considered a further draft draft of its report alongside the advisers' final report which had been received the previous day. The Panel recognised that a detailed comparison was required to be made between the recommendations of the Panel and those of the advisor. This was necessary to ensure that there was no space for a wedge to be driven between the two reports.
