Amendment to P.51/2024 Budget 2025 – 2028.

Further to the States Assembly passing P.69/2024 on funding for culture, arts and heritage, this amendment seeks to reinstate the 1% commitment over overall States revenue expenditure into the Budget for 2025 - 2028.

A full CRIA has been completed in relation to the proposition P.69/2024, and therefore has already considered any implications on children's rights.

2) Which groups of children and young people are likely to be affected? Groups of children could include early years, primary or secondary education; young adults; children with additional learning needs; disabled children; children living in poverty; children from particular ethnic backgrounds; migrants; refugees; care experienced children and LGBTQ+ children

As identified in the CRIA attached to P.69/2024, additional funding for arts, heritage and culture has the potential to impact upon all groups of children and young persons.

As identified in the CRIA attached to P.69/2024,

Positive impacts on the following rights described in the UNCRC:

- Best interests of the Child (Art 3)
- Freedom of expression (Art 13)
- Freedom of association (Art 15)
- Right to a standard of living that is good enough to meet the child's physical and social needs and support their development (Art 27)
- Right to education (Art 28)

• Leisure, play and culture (Art 31)

These positive impacts could bring added benefits to groups of children who might have additional need of, and/or less access to, such resources, including children with additional learning needs, children living in poverty, or disabled children.
