The majority of the expenditure was related to advertising the call for evidence for the review on the fulfilment industry and its effects on the local economy in the Jersey Evening Post.	
	The Panel noted its expenditure for the year to date.	
2.	Strategic Plan 2006-2011	
	The Committee received work carried out on the Strategic Plan, based on input from Deputies Breckon, Martin and Lewis.	
	The Panel noted the current conclusions, but commented that the main shortcoming of the plan was its lack of any indication as to the cost of the measures proposed.	
	Although the Plan was presented as a high-level strategy document, and therefore not costed, it was suggested that it was to be funded from within existing cash limits, and that it was based on previous estimates of States revenue. It was described in the introduction as 'achievable and affordable'.	
	The Panel was of the opinion that if the plan had not been fully costed, it was not clear how it could be claimed that it would fall within existing cash limits. If it had been costed, then those estimates should be brought forward for debate at the same time as the plan itself, in order to avoid the States voting for policies which would have an unknown impact on its budget.
