Question

Given that, during Questions Without Notice in the Assembly on 8th June 2021, the Chief Minister indicated that some of the recommendations made by the Housing Policy Development Board in R.63/2021 were "not accepted", will the Chief Minister state which of the recommendations were not accepted, and what deliberations were undertaken by the Government in making such a decision?

Answer – Revised in accordance with Standing Order 12(4)

The Government's response to the recommendations of the HPDB is contained within the <u>Creating Better Homes Action Plan</u>, published on 4 June 2021.

Recommendations that are not accepted, as set out in pages 51 to 53 of the Plan, are:

The Government is already taking forward many of the Board's recommendations, principally through the Government Plan and Island Plan frameworks, which is reflected in the Creating Better Homes Action Plan.
