

**WRITTEN QUESTION TO THE MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND TECHNICAL SERVICES BY
THE DEPUTY OF ST. MARY
ANSWER TO BE TABLED ON TUESDAY 19th MAY 2009**

Question

“Can the Minister inform the Assembly how much non-inert waste the Transport and Technical Services Department dealt with in 2008, with the detail of the different types of waste, and the comparable figures for the previous year?”

Answer

The total amount of non-inert waste that the Transport and Technical Services Department dealt with in 2008 was 103,231 tonnes compared to 106,587 tonnes in 2007 as detailed below:
