	1. Meeting with Minister for Treasury and Resources	
	The Panel met Senator P.F.C Ozouf, Minister for Treasury and Resources, in conjunction with Mr. I. Black, Treasurer of the States, Mr. J. Turner, Deputy Treasurer of the States, and Ms. A. Taylor, Head of Financial Reporting. During the course of the meeting, consideration was given to <i>States of Jersey Financial Report and Accounts 2008</i> (R.63/2009); the 2010 Annual Business Plan; and the draft Depositors' Compensation Scheme. Parts of this meeting were held in private session under Article 3.2.1(b) of <i>Code of Practice on Public Access to Official Information</i> and a separate record was taken.	
	2. Records of Meetings  The Panel approved the record of its meeting on 11th June 2009. It was noted that the records of 11th February, 18th May and 27th May 2009, whilst previously approved, had not yet been signed. All four records were subsequently signed.	
	3, Matters Arising  The Panel noted the update on actions it had requested at previous meetings.

## 11/06/09, 6. Jersey Development Company Item 10 The Panel was advised by the Chairman that she had corresponded with 513/21(8) a number of Connétables about taking part in the review of Property and Infrastructure Regeneration: The States of Jersey Development Company Limited (P.79/2009); however, none would be able to do so. It was agreed the Chairman would raise the matter at the next meeting of the Chairmen's Committee. The Officers were requested to contact all Scrutiny Members to ascertain whether any Members would be interested in taking part in the review. Consideration was given to a draft Scoping Document; Project Plan and Terms of Reference. The Panel considered in particular the potential engagement of an expert advisor. It was noted that the previous Corporate Services Scrutiny Panel had engaged Mr. R. Wragg and Mr. R. Law as advisors for some of its reviews. The Officers were requested to circulate information on both advisors to the Panel though it was noted that neither might be able or willing to assist with the review of P.79/2009 and that a wider search would become necessary. The Panel revised the initial budget contained in the draft Scoping Document to £24,740, with a preliminary budget for the expert advisor of £22,000. The Panel subsequently approved the Scoping Document, as amended, as well as the Project Plan and Terms of Reference. The Panel noted that a request to Senator T.A. Le Sueur, Chief Minister. that the debate on P.79/2009 be deferred to 20th October 2009 had yet received a response. It was also noted that further correspondence would be despatched to the Chief Minister to advise him of the Terms of Reference for the review. 11/06/09. 7. Annual Business Plan Item 12 2005:

The Panel gave consideration to the timescale involved in reviewing the 2010 Annual Business Plan and discussed whether a delay to the debate on the Plan should be sought. The Panel recalled its discussion with the Minister for Treasury and Resources on the matter and noted the provisions of Articles 11(1) and 17(1) of Public Finances (Jersey) Law

- 11(1) The Chief Minister, taking into account the restriction contained in paragraph (2), must lodge a draft annual business plan for a financial year in sufficient time for it to be debated and approved by the States at least 3 months before the start of that financial year or such other period as the States may decide.
- 17(1) The Minister [for Treasury and Resources], taking into account the restriction contained in paragraph (2), must lodge a budget proposition for a financial year in sufficient time for it to be debated and approved by the States no later than during the month preceding the start of that financial year or such other period as the States may decide.

The Panel recalled its previous discussions on the 2010 Annual Business Plan and, in particular, that the need to report by 7th September 2009 would only allow time for an examination of the Business Plan from the perspectives of the Chief Minister's Department and the Department of Treasury and Resources; that timescale would not allow for a full review of corporate matters. It was agreed that a review of the Business Plan should be scoped. It was further agreed that consideration would be SF

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	given to the potential engagement of an expert advisor once scoping had occurred.	
	The Panel noted receipt of the draft Key Objectives for the 2010 Annual Business Plan that had been forwarded following a request made by the Chairman. The draft Key Objectives had been considered by the Council of Ministers on 12th June 2009 and were confidential under Article 3.2.1(a)(xiv) of Code of Practice for Public Access to Official Information. It was agreed that Panel Members would read the draft Key Objectives and e-mail any comments that might arise to the Officers.	Panel
