


## Childcare Act NEW Local Authority duties to: - improve outcomes for under 5's through access to integrated early childhood services - secure sufficient childcare for children to allow parents to work - continuing the free entitlement for 3s and 4s - provide information to parents about services for children up to 19 - Reformed and streamlined regularly and inspection for childcare - New Early Years Foundation Stage





PArT  Why pilot free provision for two year olds?  EPPE Evidence
Pre-school experience, compared to none enhances intellectual and social development in all children.
*Good quality pre-school experiences supports better cognitive & social-behavioural development for children and reduces risk of SEN.
-Disadvantaged children in particular can benefit significantly from good quality pre-school experiences - particular advantages when starting at 2.
-For children in low income families (less than £15k pa), one extra year of pre-school (starting at 2 rather than 3) is associated with a similar effect upon pre-reading as increasing family income by £10-15k per year.

*is a block of the 'Dedicated Schools Grant' (DSG)
*Schools Forums have to agree with Local Authorities how DSG is used.
•Code of Practice for provision of free nursery education for 3 & 4 year olds
*Local Authorities decide local criteria.
Can be paid to more than one provider (parental choice).
Parents may choose which provider receives funding
•Administered by Local Authority
◆Paid directly to providers
•£3.00 - £3.50 per hour
*Can be used with childcare tax credit.

Make provision more flexible, sustainable and responsive to the needs of the community. Reshape existing provision and commission new provision. Meet the needs of parents.
