Explanatory Note

These Regulations would restrict the entitlement to the sale of subsidized milk to beneficiaries whose household income does not exceed £25,000 per annum.

The Regulations would come into force on the 3rd day of January 1999.

THE STATES, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Order in Council of the fourteenth day of April 1884,¹ have made the following Regulations -

1. After Regulation 3 of the Milk (Sale to Special Classes) (Jersey) Regulations 1998² (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Regulations”) there shall be inserted the following Regulation -

“Maximum income level

3A.-(1) Regulation 3 of these Regulations shall not apply to a child under five years of age where the income of the person having custody of the child exceeds £25,000 per annum.

(2) Regulation 3 of these Regulations shall not apply to any other beneficiary whose income exceeds £25,000 per annum.

(3) For the purposes of this Regulation, the income of any person who is cohabiting with any other person includes the income of that other person.”.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Milk (Sale to Special Classes) (Amendment) (Jersey) Regulations 199 and shall come into force on the third day of January 1999.
