Explanatory Note

These Regulations further amend Article 88A of the Licensing (Jersey) Law 1974, which is the provision allowing extended opening hours for licensed premises on the occasion of the Millennium.

The amendment has the effect that, during those extended opening hours, a person under the age of eighteen may remain after 9 p.m. in a room in which there is a public bar which is part of licensed premises to which the extended hours apply.

The requirements that the room must be a suitable environment for persons under the age of eighteen and that such a person may only enter or remain in the room if he is accompanied by and in the charge of an adult are unaffected by the amendment.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Article 92 of the Licensing (Jersey) Law 1974,¹ as amended (hereinafter referred to as “the Law”), have made the following Regulations -

1. For paragraph (5) of Article 88A of the Law² there shall be substituted the following paragraph -

“(5) Where paragraph (1) of this Article applies in respect of a licence, during the period of permitted hours described in that paragraph -

- (a) the general condition in sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) of Article 12 of this Law shall apply with the omission of the words “until 21.00 hours” in the proviso; and
- (b) no restriction in respect of the licence, or in respect of any premises to which it relates, specified in paragraph (8) of this Article shall apply.”.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Licensing (No.14) (Jersey) Regulations 199 and shall come into force on the day following promulgation.
