<p>The Council of Minister's Amendment to the Corporate Services Panel's Third Amendment to the Budget 2025-2028 [P.51/2024] amends a revision to the budget allocation within the Revenue Heads of Expenditure for the Cabinet Office funding for Statistics Jersey to be increased by £79,000 in 2025 to fund the Business Tendency Survey.</p>
