item i	The Panel noted that the scoping documents, Terms of Reference and time line had been accepted by the Chairman's Committee.	
	The Panel received a folder with all current documentation as supplied by the Treasury Department relating to the bids along with other relevant documents. Referring to those documents and a briefing from the Fiscal Stimulus Programme Manager, from the Treasury, on 24 th September 2009, the Panel noted that there appeared to be a position of openness taken by the Department which was both very welcome and confirmed the good working relationship between the Panel and Executive within its remit. 	An oral update was received relating to a meeting between the Panel's advisor, the officer and the Economic Advisor of the Chief Minister's Department. A written report would follow in due course.	MR
	Members agreed to read the documents contained within the file and to supply the officer with an e-mail outlining questions which would assist the hearing arranged for 15 th October 2009. The Panel agreed to meet for the entire day on the 13 th October 2009 to examine the individual bids and to receive witnesses in hearings.	Panel/ MR
	In considering the first term of reference for the review, the Panel considered the evidencing of where the Island currently was on the recession curve. Whilst the Treasury would have information about this, the Panel agreed that it needed an independent source of information. It agreed that a United Kingdom firm should advise the Panel on the national situation and the advisor, Professor M. Oliver, be requested to use that information to describe the local position. The Panel agreed that a company with a respected reputation, such as Lombard Street Research, would be suitable for the role. The company were to be approached and a budget of £3000 was approved for the work. The company was also to be asked to look at the local data at the same time.	MR

The Panel accepted that there were insufficient resources available for the office to undertake this task and that there was insufficient time available to engage a local market research company to do the work. It therefore decided that Members would undertake the work assisted where possible by the office. A member was tasked with liasing with the officer to undertake the task. It was agreed that the survey should enquire from sole traders, medium sized traders and larger traders in various sections of the business community such as tradesmen, retail and communications etc. The questions to be asked were to be discussed with the Statistics Unit to ensure they were robust and impartial and the results would be collected by the Member on 12 th October 2009 and returned to the office.
