Report

Part of the proposed new vehicle technical standards subordinate legislation will be a new Lighting Order which will be enacted under the vires of the existing Road Traffic Law 1956 - which removes the anomalous situation prevailing at the present time whereby all provisions relating to the technical standards of vehicles and their use come under the Road Traffic (Jersey) Law 1956 - except for lighting, which is enacted under the Road Transport Lighting (Jersey) Law 1956.

In order for the administration of this change to take place smoothly the Road Transport Lighting (Jersey) Law 1956 must be repealed by the States and confirmed by Privy Council before the new lighting provisions can be implemented, as from an appointed day yet to be agreed by the States.

Explanatory Note

This Law repeals the Road Transport Lighting (Jersey) Law 1956 (and Regulations which amended that Law) with effect from such day as the States may by Act appoint.

THE STATES, subject to the sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, have adopted the following Law -

ARTICLE 1

The following enactments are repealed -

- (a) the Road Transport Lighting (Jersey) Law 1956;¹
- (b) the Road Transport Lighting (Amendment) Regulations 1973;²
- (c) the Road Transport Lighting (Amendment No. 2) (Jersey) Regulations 1982;³ and
- (d) the Road Transport Lighting (Amendment No. 3) (Jersey) Regulations 1984.⁴

ARTICLE 2

This Law may be cited as the Road Transport Lighting (Repeal) (Jersey) Law 199 and shall come into force on such day as the States may by Act appoint.
