THE STATES rejected the proposition of Deputy John Le Gallais of St. Saviour that sub-paragraphs (i), (ii), (iii), (iii), (iv) and (v) of paragraph (a), and paragraphs (b) to (g) of the Proposition regarding Rezoning of land for Category A housing be considered at this Sitting, the remainder of the sub-paragraphs in paragraph (a) being deferred to a later date.

Registration and restrictions on use of wells and bore holes. Statement.

The President of the Public Works Committee made a statement in the following terms -

"In my statement to the States on 17th August, I said the Island's objective was to reduce the weekly loss of water stored in the Jersey New Waterworks Company's reservoirs from the average of 10 million gallons per week before the declaration of the State of Emergency to 4 million gallons per week.

In the first six days the loss fell by 5 million gallons, however, in the past week, despite a continued small decline in consumption of Company water, the loss was 7.1 million gallons.

A factor in this unsatisfactory situation is the diminution in stream flows which can in part be attributed to the scale of abstraction from wells and boreholes.

The Public Works Committee has for some time been aware of the potential consequences of unrestricted abstraction from those sources and a preliminary survey by the British Geological Survey was undertaken earlier this year. An amount has already been inscribed in next year's budget in order to undertake a more thorough investigation.

Recent estimates made by the Jersey New Waterworks Company at the request of Public Works suggest that, in the present circumstances, abstraction significantly exceeds the rate of replenishment of underground water in a year of average rainfall.

Accordingly, the Public Works Committee will, subject to the resolution today of any outstanding problems, give notice that all wells and boreholes are to be registered and that abstraction from them will, in the case of supplies to domestic households, be subject to the same restrictions as are supplies of Company water to domestic consumers.

Abstraction for any commercial purpose will require a water meter (supplied at the expense of the States) to be fitted to the source, and commercial consumers will be restricted in the same categories and to the same extent as though they were supplied by the Jersey New Waterworks Company.

It is the opinion of the Public Works Committee that these measures are essential to conserve the Island's water resources to withstand the present period of dry weather which shows no indication at present of when it will end. They are necessary also to safeguard future supplies and reduce the risk of polluting underground fresh water resources with sea water.

The administration of these restrictions will impose a demand beyond the capacity of the Public Works Department and I take this opportunity to ask for the cooperation of other committees when assistance is sought."

(iii) to authorise the payment or discharge of the expenses to be incurred in connexion with the acquisition of the said land and buildings and all interest therein and of the payment of all legal expenses from the Island Development Committee Major Reserve Vote CO904 or the Housing Committee Land Purchase Vote C1104;"
