DRAFT INCOME SUPPORT (AMENDMENT No. 16) (JERSEY) REGULATIONS 201-

REPORT

1. Summary of the draft Regulations

These draft Regulations increase all Income Support components by 2.9% – in line with the latest increase in the Retail Prices Index ("RPI") of March 2017.

Most of the components have been fixed during 2015 and 2016, and the proposed 2.9% increase across all components from 1st October 2017 ensures that all households claiming Income Support will benefit from this change.

The Council of Ministers fully supports the proposal, which will help all households claiming Income Support.

These Regulations have been submitted for approval before the summer recess in order to allow time for the new values to be processed before 1st October 2017.

2. Improving Income Support

The Minister for Social Security is proposing to improve Income Support this year by –

- (i) increasing all the Income Support components by 2.9%; and
- (ii) strengthening the financial incentives for households to increase their income.

The first part of the above proposal is included in these draft Regulations.

The Minister for Social Security is also planning to strengthen the financial incentives for households to increase their income, by increasing all the income disregards from 23% to 25% from 1st October 2017.

The Minister will increase the income disregards by Ministerial Order following the approval of these Regulations.

3. MTFP and benefit savings

The Medium Term Financial Plan ("MTFP") 2016 – 2019 sets out the Social Security Department's spending plans and spending limits up to the end of 2019.

The States agreed a package of measures in the MTFP 2016-2019 to invest in strategic priority areas and improve infrastructure. As part of these plans, the Department agreed to propose a £10 million annual reduction in the benefit budget by 2019, which on a like-for-like basis means that the benefit budget is flat for the period.

These changes were carefully chosen to meet the following objectives –



- promote financial independence
- minimise the impact on individuals
- improve the targeting of benefits.

4. Component increases

The basic living cost components, housing components, impairment components, childcare day components and carer's component are all increased by 2.9% in these Regulations.

5. Support for Social Housing

Following the approval of the Housing Transformation Programme in 2013, changes were made to the Income Support Regulations to allow social sector rentals values to move towards 90% of market value. Component values are no longer needed within the Income Support Regulations, and rental components for social sector tenants (Andium and Housing Trusts) are adjusted automatically each year.

Collective responsibility under Standing Order 21(3A)

The Council of Ministers has a single policy position on this proposition, and as such, all Ministers, and the Assistant Minister for Social Security, are bound by the principle of collective responsibility to support the proposition, as outlined in the Code of Conduct and Practice for Ministers and Assistant Ministers (R.11/2015 refers).

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Financial and manpower implications

The estimated cost of £3.9 million a year for this overall package (i.e. increases to the components and the income disregards) has been built into the Department's budget in the MTFP 2016-2019. There are no staff or other resource implications arising from this proposal.

Explanatory Note

These Regulations amend the Income Support (Jersey) Regulations 2007 to increase the rates of the basic, housing, impairment, child care and carer's components of income support by 2.9% in line with the latest increases in the Jersey Retail Prices Index (March 2017) (*Regulation 1*).

Regulation 2 sets out the title of these Regulations and provides that they shall come into force on 1st October 2017.

 - "(2) The rate of clinical cost element of the impairment component is
 - (a) £3.29; or
 - (b) if, based on the criteria set out in sub-paragraph (1)(b), the member will need at least 9 consultations with an approved medical practitioner, £6.58.";
- (h) for paragraph 10(3) there shall be substituted the following subparagraph
 - "(3) The rates payable under this sub-paragraph are
 - (a) for a child under the age of 3 years
 - for a child aged 3 years or over £5.30.";
- (i) for paragraph 12 there shall be substituted the following paragraph –
- "12 Rate for the carer's component

The rate payable in respect of the carer's component is £48.37.".

2 Citation and commencement

These Regulations may be cited as the Income Support (Amendment No. 16) (Jersey) Regulations 201- and shall come into force on 1st October 2017.
