I watched the end of the report on Jersey air pollution on Channel Television recently. My husband and I are senior citizens and we live in a bungalow at the lower end of Patier Road in St Saviour. Our bedroom window is only three metres from the road down which, every weekday morning, from around 08.15 until 09.00, the rush hour traffic, including heavy goods vehicles, are virtually stationary for minutes on end, and are nose to tail.

I would be very interested to know the level of air pollution created during these periods, and also the possible effects on pedestrians, and on us inside our premises. Rush hour traffic fumes close to dwellings and pedestrians en route to work or schools must be quite significant. Measuring the amount of this pollution could provide important information in the car wars / transport debate.
