2. Deputy P.V.F. Le Claire of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Transport and Technical Services –

“Would the Minister advise whether he has received advice from the Law Officers' Department concerning the system used for issuing parking fines on the streets of St. Helier and, if so, would he advise whether the system is ultra vires, whether all fines collected in this way will have to be reimbursed and will he agree to release the correspondence containing this advice to the Assembly?”
3. The Deputy of St. Martin will ask the following question of the Minister for Health and Social Services –

“Given that a hospital Consultant and 2 Middle Grade doctors have performed no clinical work since October 2006, December 2008, and August 2009 respectively, and that a fourth Middle Grade doctor is undertaking restricted duties only, will the Minister state how many different locum doctors have been employed to do the work of the 4 affected doctors, and what is the cost of these locums to date?”
4. The Deputy of St. John will ask the following question of the Minister for Transport and Technical Services –

“Will an appeal procedure be available to anyone who is adversely affected by routes amended by the new summer bus timetable?”
5. Senator J.L. Perchard will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“As Chairman of the States Employment Board, what action, if any will the Chief Minister be taking to limit the level of payment granted in a severance package to any employee of the States of Jersey who, for whatever reason, is leaving their position?”
6. Deputy T.A. Vallois of St. Saviour will ask the following question of the Minister for Transport and Technical Services –

“Given that the funding proposition for the Energy from Waste plant put forward by the Minister for Treasury and Resources and debated in 2008 established funding of £106,310,000, of which £2,080,000 was determined as the required amount for the decommissioning of Bellozanne in 2012, would the Minister advise whether he has had to bid for further funding and, if so, explain why?”

7. Deputy R.G. Le Hérisier of St. Saviour will ask the following question of the Chairman of Public Accounts Committee –

“Given that recent reports from the Public Accounts Committee have cited the absence of enforceable accountability as a major weakness in the structure of government, would he outline what reforms, if any, the Committee proposes?”

8. Senator S.C. Ferguson will ask the following question of the Minister for Planning and Environment –

“The 160 acres of land reclaimed in St Helier has been economically beneficial to Jersey. Why does the new Island Plan say the preferred option for disposing of solid waste, such as building rubble, is to fill in disused quarry workings because the marine habitat is ‘of higher importance and more sensitive than terrestrial habitats’? (Island Plan 11.91.)”

9. Senator B.E. Shenton will ask the following question of the Minister for Health and Social Services –

“Given the announcement of the World Health Organisation’s International Agency for Research on Cancer that mobile phones may cause glioma, a type of brain tumour that starts in the brain or spine, with the Minister give assurances that she will keep Islanders fully informed of any health risks connected with mobile phone use?”

10. Senator F. du H. Le Gresley will ask the following question of the Minister for Social Security –

“What additional measures, if any, are being put into place to assist the 190 people who have been unemployed and actively seeking work for more than 52 weeks and how many in this group, as at the 30th April 2011, were aged between 16 and 19 years?”

11. The Connétable of St. Mary will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Further to reports that the BBC’s Channel Island news service could be under threat in the wake of the Broadcaster’s aim of making multi-million pound savings across its entire operation, will the Chief Minister advise whether he considers this to be a matter of concern and whether this has been discussed at the Council of Ministers and, if so, has any representation been made to the Corporation?”

12. Deputy S. Pitman of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

“Following his response to my question on 17th May 2011, would the Minister advise whether the CCTV cameras at Springfield Stadium are now in operation and, if so, when are they switched on and for how long?”

13. Deputy K.C. Lewis of St. Saviour will ask the following question of the Minister for Home Affairs –

“Further to the statement in the Customs and Immigration Service’s Annual Report 2010 that the complement of Customs and Immigration officers is three below minimum operating effectiveness due to funding cuts in previous years, will the Minister be applying for funds from the Criminal Offences Confiscations Fund to enable the department to be brought back up to strength?”

14. Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Chief Minister -

“Further to the information in the Customs and Immigration Service’s Annual Report 2010 that 178 work permits were issued in 2010 for non-EU citizens to work in the finance, medical and legal sectors, will the Chief Minister state whether the Strategic Plan aim of capping inward migration at 150 heads of household is being achieved and confirm whether the employees on work permits are counted in the overall immigration total?”

15. The Deputy of St. Mary will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Would the Chief Minister confirm whether FG Hemisphere is using the courts in Jersey to enforce debt repayments by the Democratic Republic of Congo in a way which has just been outlawed by the UK Parliament and, if so, does the CM think it is appropriate for the Jersey courts to be used in this way, and what actions, if any, has he taken and does he propose to take on this matter?”

16. Deputy M. Tadier of St. Brelade will ask the following question of the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

“Will the Minister update the Assembly on the current state of disabled facilities and access for students at Highland's college, including any future upgrades and refurbishment?”

* The following question has now been redirected from the Minister for Economic Development to the Minister for Treasury and Resources –

17. Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Treasury and Resources –

“Could the Minister explain how and where he expects the private sector to generate the jobs required to provide employment to those currently unemployed, to meet the needs of our school leavers and to replace those jobs expected to be lost in the public sector, which a University of Manchester study shows has been responsible for nearly 60% of the growth in jobs in the United Kingdom since 1997?”

18. Deputy T.M. Pitman of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Will the Chief Minister clarify the exact sums paid as ‘golden handshakes’ to two civil servants, clarify who was paid which sum and explain why such large payments were considered justified?”

19. Deputy M. Tadier of St. Brelade will ask the following question of the Minister for Transport and Technical Services –

“Will the Minister advise what plans, if any, he has to introduce kerb-side collection for recyclables on an island-wide basis?”

20. The Deputy of St. Martin will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Will the Chief Minister inform Members of the cost of the investigation into my serious complaint against a senior civil servant and given that the Wiltshire Report was put into the public domain, will the Investigator's Report be made public and if not, why not?”

21. Deputy R.G. Le Hérissier of St. Saviour will ask the following question of the Chief Minister–

“To what extent were the purported final payments to two senior civil servants determined by the results they achieved?”

22. The Deputy of St. John will ask the following question of the Minister for Economic Development-

“Would the Minister confirm that arrivals figures have increased and, if so, would he detail whether the increase is in day-tripper footfall or staying guests, and, if the latter, in which type of accommodation they are staying, indicating the level of star if a hotel or guest house or whether they are believed to be staying with friends?”

23. The Deputy of St. Mary will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“In the light of the forthcoming debate on the draft Island Plan 2011, will the Chief Minister tell members the latest intentions of the Council of Ministers with regard to the population which the Council considers is right for the Island, and how the Council will achieve this?”
