PUBLIC HAVE LOST FAITH IN PLANNING PROCESS

The above report in last Saturday's JEP has motivated me to bring to your attention two continuing aggravations in St. Ouen – although I am sure you do not want to hear from me.

- 1. We attended a consultation planning meeting at Les Landes School <u>before</u> the new housing estate next door began. We were assured that construction traffic would park in a dedicated field; before any new occupants were allowed to move in, ALL St. George's estate residents' parking would be moved OFF the congested road and a school collection system would operate. None of this has happened and the field adjacent to the school which was on the market for £30,000 was rejected because there was no money. How much has the school extension cost? Surely the safety of school children is a priority?
- 2. Mr. 's agricultural site must be the worst eyesore in the parish. The two large houses have never been finished and even if landscaping starts now it will take years to camouflage this mess.

I have an interest in a planning application which has been in the pipeline for years. I don't want to identify it in case my comments delay the process even further. What baffles me is how Planning can give permission for the above atrocities yet procrastinate on an application which, if granted, will benefit us all.
