“Following the recent report into the cost of living in Jersey being some 20% higher than in the United Kingdom, will the Minister explain what ‘hard questions’ he will be asking and of whom, and what steps he will be taking to deal with this matter?”
2. Deputy S.Y. Mézec of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Would the Chief Minister advise whether he is supportive of holding a Royal Commission into electoral reform in Jersey and, if so, does he intend to lodge a proposition for consideration by the Assembly in relation to this issue before the general election in October?”



3. Deputy J.H. Young of St. Brelade will ask the following question of the Minister for Planning and Environment –

“Do Planning Officers Society recommendations for the future of the Planning system (December 2013) reflect the opinion of the Minister and, if implemented, will they mean that future Ministers will be required to balance and trade off the environmental protection of Jersey’s coasts, heritage and countryside against conflicting economic and financial interests, undermining Planning Law and the Island plan policies, and, if so, what does he intend to do?”

4. Deputy G.C.L. Baudains of St. Clement will ask the following question of the Minister for Treasury and Resources –

“Does the Minister consider that it would be more prudent to convert departmental underspends into savings rather than finding new ways of spending the money?”

5. The Deputy of St. Martin will ask the following question of the Minister for Transport and Technical Services –

“Given that it is now over a year since subsidence occurred below the Pine Walk in St. Martin, can the Minister inform the Assembly whether this important road has been properly stabilized and, if not, would he explain the reasons for the delay?”

6. The Connétable of St. Lawrence will ask the following question of the Minister for Health and Social Services –

“Will the Minister advise the Assembly whether there is broadband provision for patients within the General Hospital?”

7. Deputy N.B. Le Cornu of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Does the Chief Minister agree that an effective policy in respect of the rights and obligations of whistle-blowers in the public sector, is an essential feature of any modern democracy committed to transparency and integrity in government and, if so, will he produce such a policy and bring it to the Assembly for approval before publishing it on the gov.je website?”

8. Deputy R.G. Le Hérissier of St. Saviour will ask the following question of the Minister for Home Affairs –

“Given the revelations of the former Drugs and Addictions Counsellor at H.M. Prison La Moye, could the Minister identify if and when concerns were raised about her conduct, whether it was considered that a possible criminal offence had been committed which required the intervention of the police and, if so, why was this person allowed to resign with no police follow up?”

9. Deputy M. Tadier of St. Brelade will ask the following question of the Minister for Home Affairs –

“Following his response to questions on 4th March 2014, regarding allegations of impropriety at the Prison circulated via an email by an anonymous whistle-blower, will the Ministers update Members of what subsequent action he taken in relation to this?”



10. Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Will the Chief Minister assure members that he will publish the results of investigations into NT (No Tax) activities in the Island which facilitate or administer schemes which appear to constitute ‘aggressive tax avoidance’ and will he agree to broaden the investigation to establish the extent of these types of activities in the Island’s finance sector and report back his finding to the States by the end of July?”

* 11. Deputy J.A. Hilton of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Is the Chief Minister satisfied that all States departments are fulfilling their legal obligations under the Law when dealing with the management of asbestos within the public buildings they occupy?”

12. Deputy M. Tadier of St. Brelade will ask the following question of the Minister for Health and Social Services –

“Will the Minister confirm whether her department has been approached by any individual with a view to importing cannabis for medicinal use and, if so, what steps would be necessary to enable GPs to import and prescribe cannabis for medicinal use for their patients?”

13. Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Does the Chief Minister accept that the proposal to move PECRS pensions from a final salary to a career average basis discriminates against women who often take career breaks or work part time to raise children and, if so, what advice, if any, has been sought as to whether the revised scheme could be challenged under the Discrimination Law when the provision relating to sex discrimination comes into force?”

14. Deputy R.G. Le Hérissier of St. Saviour will ask the following question of the Minister for Home Affairs –

“Were a large number of mobile phones circulating within the Prison and allegedly linked to a high profile inmate and, if so, was the Board of Visitors informed and what action, if any, did it take?”

15. Deputy J.H. Young of St. Brelade will ask the following question of the Minister for Planning and Environment –

“Further to large scale developments on Jersey’s coasts such as at Portelet and La Coupe approved by previous Ministers and public concern over future developments he has approved at Plémont and Grouville, will the Minister ensure that at the conclusion of his term of office he leaves behind a legacy of a strong planning policy regime to ensure Jersey’s coasts remain unspoilt for future generations and, if not, why not?”

Explanatory Note regarding subordinate legislation tabled at this meeting.

R&O.26/2014.

This Order increases the limits on expenses that may be charged to a third-party motor insurer for treatment of a victim of a road traffic accident. The increase applies to treatment arising from accidents occurring on or after 1st April 2014.

The revised expenses limits are the same as those that apply in the United Kingdom under the NHS Injury Cost Recovery Scheme with effect from 1st April 2014.

The Order was made on 12th March 2014 and comes into force on 1st April 2014.
