### **Explanatory Note**

These Regulations specify jurisdictions for the purposes of two provisions of the Probate (Jersey) Law 1998.

Where a deceased person dies domiciled in one of the jurisdictions specified in these Regulations -

- (a) Article 6(7) of the said Law enables the Judicial Greffier to make a grant of probate or administration without making enquiries if the application is made in accordance with rules of court; and
- (b) Article 21 of the said Law protects a person who releases movable estate not exceeding £10,000, without having seen a grant, from action by the deceased's estate or any beneficiary of it if the recipient produces evidence of his entitlement in accordance with rules of court and there is no caveat in force against the deceased's estate.

**THE STATES**, in pursuance of Article 31 of the Probate (Jersey) Law 1998<sup>1</sup> (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Law”), have made the following Regulations -

1. The following jurisdictions are specified for the purposes of paragraph (7) of Article 6 and paragraph (1) of Article 21 of the principal Law,<sup>2</sup> namely -

England and Wales

Guernsey

Isle of Man

Northern Ireland

Scotland.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Probate (General Provisions) (Jersey) Regulations 199 and shall come into force on the fifteenth day of September 1998.
