Draft Disability Discrimination Regulations</p> <p>The Chairman advised that he had discussed with the Minister for Social Security the Panel's intention to refer the Regulations back to Scrutiny. The Minister had expressed concerns via an email exchange about the delay it would cause in terms of the implementation date of the Regulations.</p> <p>The Panel discussed the matter and agreed that, although it may cause a delay, the matter of addiction needed further consultation and research and therefore the Regulations would be referred back to Scrutiny.</p> <p>The Panel noted and approved the Comments paper.
