

Progress to Date and Next Steps</p> <p>The Sub-Panel considered the progress of its Review to date and discussed its next steps, and agreed the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Chairman, accompanied by the Sub-Panel's Officer, would seek a meeting with the Minister for Planning and Environment and his Chief Officer to discuss certain outstanding questions, and report back to the Sub-Panel on the outcome of any meeting; • The Chairman, accompanied by the Sub-Panel's Officer, would seek a private meeting with Deputy P.J. Rondel, as it appeared unlikely at this stage that the Deputy would agree to attend a Hearing. The Sub-Panel would be updated as to the outcome of any meeting; • The Sub-Panel would give this further consideration to its initial discussion of Heads of Report, and would circulate ideas by email. In addition, Senator A. Breckon would circulate a number of points to be considered for inclusion in the report in relation to the Jersey Appointments Commission's role; • Further consideration would be given to possible questions that the Sub-Panel could consider putting in writing to Mr R.A.
