>Naturally, I am aware that I am far from alone in my worries but as one
>of the proposed, and now approved sites is on my land, my concerns
>increase daily. Contrary to the "no surprise" expressed by the Jersey
>Mobile Mast Concern Group, I was amazed by the passing of these sites
>prior to a result from the scrutiny panel. I have from the initial
>talks with the phone co's expressed nothing but concern on many
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>levels. The area to which I refer is Mont Mallet, St. Martin. This is a >heavily built up area and one where we already have a mast on Gorey >Pier and another (J.Telecoms) looming above our property and extremely >close to others who also have great fears for their health. I believe >J. Telecoms have made some noises about moving their mast but to where >and when? This piece of land is also environmentally important and >fragile and for >me to commit to this sort of ground and air impact is, I feel, unfair >to many others who enjoy leisure time here. I was amazed to hear that a >meeting had taken place with one of the phone companies and the >planning dept when they assured me that their application would be >passed (even quoting the date), When we requested a meeting early on in >these discussions in order to talk about the sensitivity of the area. >it was denied on the grounds of the dept being too busy. >It may seem strange to have allowed the proceedings to go this far but >a) during a telephone conversation with a member of staff at planning we >were told that masts were definitely going to go up at this site and we >felt so directly affected that we needed some sort of control as to >where and b) I also had some confidence in planning to put the health

>of locals above the needs of these non local companies and allow The >Scrutiny Panel to pursue and complete a report. I am grateful for your >time in reading the above and my attached letter and would request if >at all possible, a short time to show you the land in question. This is >a major concern for myself and family and I have found it extremely >difficult to know from whom to seek advice. Thanking you in >anticipation,
