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REPORT

Introduction

1. Following his appointment by the States Assembly, the Chief Minister, in accordance with Standing Order 117(2) and (2B), gave notice to the States Assembly of his nominations for ministerial office, together with an [explanatory note regarding his nominations](#). The explanatory note stated that –

“The Chief Minister designate intends to lodge draft Regulations pursuant to Article 29(2) of the States of Jersey Law 2005, which would propose the transfer of certain functions between some existing ministerial portfolios and the creation of a new ministerial office, as explained below. Instructions for the necessary draft Regulations would be decided upon following the formation of the new Council of Ministers, taking into account the views which States Members may express during the election of Ministers, and the States Assembly would be asked to decide upon these changes in due course.

Initially, responsibility for financial services, the digital sector, competition and innovation will be combined under the remit of the Chief Minister. Senator Philip Ozouf will be appointed as an Assistant Chief Minister with delegated responsibility for this portfolio. Subsequently, the creation of a new ministerial office will be proposed to take responsibility for this portfolio. If the creation of this new ministerial office is agreed by the States Assembly, then the Chief Minister designate would intend to nominate Senator Philip Ozouf for this new ministerial position.

Education, Sport and Culture will become Education and Skills, in order to bring together responsibility for improvements in educational and vocational standards, and to equip our local workforce with the skills they need.

Economic Development will bring together responsibility for tourism, retail, sport and culture, gambling and the lottery, air and sea links, farming, business development and inward investment, in order to attract new visitors and businesses, and to encourage more participation in our community.

Planning and Environment will take the lead on the marine environment and seas fisheries.

Responsibility for Jersey Property Holdings will be transferred from Treasury and Resources to Transport and Technical Services.”.

2. Following the appointment as Ministers of each of the members nominated by the Chief Minister and the formation of the new Council of Ministers, the Chief Minister discussed and considered with individual Ministers the appointment of Assistant Ministers. The Chief Minister subsequently consented to the appointment of Assistant Ministers as set out in [R.160/2014](#). The appointment of Assistant Ministers was made having regard to the transfers of functions that the Chief Minister had previously indicated, and a number of Assistant Minister appointments were made as an interim measure in order to ensure that the legal functions intended for subsequent transfer could be appropriately delegated.
3. These draft Regulations would, therefore, complete the transfer of functions agreed by Ministers and Assistant Ministers when proposed for office and indicated to the States Assembly during the appointments process.

Strategic Plan

4. These transfers are intended to underpin the Draft Strategic Plan 2015 – 2018 ([P.27/2015](#)), and in particular the need to –
 - (a) deliver positive, sustainable economic, social and environmental outcomes for Jersey;
 - (b) ensure effective, efficient and sustainable management and use of public funds; and
 - (c) ensure the provision of modern and highly valued services for the Public.

Amendment to description of Ministers

5. The draft Regulations would make the following amendments –
 - (a) the Minister for Economic Development would become the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture. This would reflect the transfer of functions set out in the draft Regulations;
 - (b) the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture would become the Minister for Education. This would reflect the transfer of functions set out in the draft Regulations;
 - (c) the Minister for Planning and Environment would become the Minister for the Environment. This would better reflect the Minister’s overarching responsibility for protecting and enhancing the Island’s environment which comprises not only the natural environment, but also the built environment which includes planning; and
 - (d) the Minister for Transport and Technical Services would become the Minister for Infrastructure. This would reflect the transfer of functions set out in the draft Regulations.

Fisheries and other aquatic resources

6. If enacted, these draft Regulations would transfer functions in respect of fisheries and other aquatic resources from the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture to the Minister for the Environment.

7. It is a goal of the Council of Ministers to –
 - (a) increase the performance of the local economy, encourage economic diversification and improve job opportunities for local people; and
 - (b) protect and enhance the Island’s natural environment.
8. This transfer would enable the Minister for the Environment to take the lead on the marine environment and sea fisheries in order to continue to support an economically viable and diverse fisheries industry within the context of the protection and enhancement of the aquatic environment.

Digital, competition and innovation

9. If enacted, these draft Regulations would transfer functions in respect of the digital sector of the economy, competition and innovation from the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture to the Chief Minister.
10. It is a goal of the Council of Ministers to increase the performance of the local economy, encourage economic diversification and improve job opportunities for local people.
11. In particular, maximising economic growth has been identified in the Draft Strategic Plan 2015 – 2018 as a priority for the Council of Ministers which includes the following key areas of focus –
 - (a) developing a plan to promote additional jobs and growth in the technology sector, with a particular focus on Fintech;
 - (b) developing and further enhancing the existing Financial Services Policy Framework to secure Jersey’s future as a leading international finance centre;
 - (c) developing a new innovation strategy to build on the success of the Innovation Fund; and
 - (d) developing a new Competition Framework and reviewing opportunities to promote competition.
12. It has become clear that the Council of Ministers needs to deliver savings and efficiencies which require an even higher degree of prioritisation of resources in terms of manpower and finances, in addition to seeking to ensure sufficient income to States revenues resulting from reinvigorated economic growth.
13. The Chief Minister is currently responsible for financial services. Financial services have been the undisputed engine of economic growth in Jersey in recent decades. However, the financial services sector of the economy faces significant challenges, not only flowing from the aftermath of the global financial crisis, but also from new technologies which are changing the landscape of financial services provision.
14. The technology sector as a standalone economic activity is regarded as an important part of the future for any developed economy and, whilst employment around the world will be altered by the digital revolution which is growing and accelerating in pace, there are significant new job opportunities with the ability for Jersey for the first time to compete in a global services market.
15. At the same time there is also a vital need to maintain competitiveness and lower prices in key consumer markets, such as energy and telecommunications, by improving and developing our competition and regulatory regimes.

16. The Chief Minister had initially proposed the creation of a new ministerial office (the Minister for Financial Services, Digital, Competition and Innovation). However, mindful of the attendant administrative infrastructure which may result from the creation of a new ministerial office, and following the recommendation of the Assistant Chief Minister, the Chief Minister considers that this not currently required. Instead, it is believed that securing jobs and growth at the rate required means that the Financial Services, Digital, Competition and Innovation role needs to maintain an exceedingly close working relationship between Ministers, but especially the Chief Minister, supported by the Assistant Chief Minister, the Minister for External Relations and the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture.
17. The bringing together of the financial services, digital and innovation portfolios under one ministerial champion is proposed in order to maximise the opportunity of success in achieving the increased jobs that are undoubtedly required for the future. These transfers would therefore assist with allowing important policy synergies across all sectors of the economy to be realised, while supporting a regulatory environment that encourages innovation and competition with the aim of stimulating future growth in the Island's economy.
18. It has also become clear to all the external facing Ministers that it would be helpful for a review of the structures of the 3 functions to be carried out. Such a review has been commissioned and may result in further recommendations, some of which may require further transfers of functions or prioritisation or re-allocation of resources. This review has the full support of the Chief Minister, the Ministers for External Relations and Economic Development and the Assistant Chief Minister with responsibility for Financial Services.

Sport and Culture

19. If enacted, these draft Regulations would transfer functions in respect of sport and culture from the Minister for Education to the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture.
20. It is a goal of the Council of Ministers to –
 - (a) provide a first-class education service, supporting the development of skills;
 - (b) increase the performance of the local economy, encourage economic diversification and improve job opportunities for local people; and
 - (c) promote sporting, leisure and cultural activities that enrich Islanders' lives.
21. In particular, improving education and maximising economic growth have been identified in the Draft Strategic Plan 2015 – 2018 as priorities for the Council of Ministers.
22. This transfer would enable the Minister for Education to focus on providing a first-class education service and supporting the development of the skills needed for the future of the Island's economy.
23. This transfer would also enable the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture to make important use of the synergies that exist between tourism, sport and culture in order to boost Jersey's economy by attracting new visitors and business to the Island. These synergies are also vitally important in improving the provision of sporting, leisure and cultural

activities in order to encourage more participation in our community and to improve the health and well-being of Islanders.

Jersey Property Holdings

24. If enacted, these Regulations would transfer functions in respect of Jersey Property Holdings from the Minister for Treasury and Resources to the Minister for Infrastructure.
25. It is a goal of the Council of Ministers to –
 - (a) protect and enhance the Island’s natural and built environment;
 - (b) provide attractive and well-maintained public spaces; protect the environment from the impact of waste products; and develop public transport, road and cycle networks that meet the needs of the community; and
 - (c) look after Jersey’s finances and assets, ensuring responsible use of public funds.
26. Jersey Property Holdings manages important States assets valued at in excess of £1 billion, political responsibility for which has previously been delegated to Assistant Ministers for Treasury and Resources. This transfer will not only ensure that this responsibility rests with a Minister, but will also enable consideration to be given to the future structure of the whole infrastructure portfolio. In particular, obvious synergies exist across the portfolio (between, for example, Jersey Property Holdings, Maintenance Services, Parks and Gardens and Transport) which must be considered in order to improve service delivery and provide efficiency savings.
27. Although the policy is still at an early stage of development, consideration will also be given to transferring liquid and solid waste sections into a Trading Account, with the intention of improving service delivery, providing efficiency savings, and developing a sustainable funding model for these vital services into the future.

Continuity

28. The draft Regulations would also ensure that all previous acts of the Ministers would continue to be valid and binding as appropriate.

Financial and manpower implications

There are no resource implications involved, other than departmental budget and staffing transfers.

Re-issue Note

This Projet has been re-issued because the Report has been substituted by the Chief Minister’s Department.

Explanatory Note

These Regulations –

- provide for new descriptions of 4 existing Ministers;
- provide for the transfer of functions as between various Ministers;
- provide for the amendment or construction of various enactments consequential upon these changes.

Regulation 1 defines the concepts of “receiving Minister” and “transferring Minister” in the context of the transfer of functions.

Regulation 2 renames –

- the Minister for Economic Development as the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture;
- the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture as the Minister for Education;
- the Minister for Planning and Environment as the Minister for the Environment;
- the Minister for Transport and Technical Services as the Minister for Infrastructure.

Schedules 1 to 4 list the enactments that are consequentially amended as a result of the changes of description of the Ministers and provide for the construction of certain Orders in Council as referring to the new descriptions.

An amendment is also made to the Standing Orders of the States of Jersey to substitute a new list of Ministers.

Regulations 3 to 7 provide for various transfers of functions as between Ministers.

Regulation 3 transfers the functions of the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture in respect of fisheries and other aquatic resources to the Minister for the Environment and further provision is made for the consequential amendment or construction of enactments.

Regulation 4 transfers the functions of the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture in respect of the digital sector of the economy, communications and broadcasting, competition, intellectual property, the Jersey Innovation Fund and the grant to Jersey Finance Limited, to the Chief Minister. Further provision is made for the consequential amendment or construction of enactments.

Regulation 5 effects the transfer of sport and culture from the Minister for Education to the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture and consequentially amends the Public Records (Jersey) Law 2002.

Regulation 6 transfers Jersey Property Holdings from the Minister for Treasury and Resources to the Minister for Infrastructure and makes a consequential change to Standing Orders.

Regulation 7 contains standard provisions for the transfer of connected rights and liabilities incurred in connection with a transfer of functions and *Regulation 8* makes standard transitional provision in relation to matters in train at the time of a transfer.

Regulation 9 makes 2 consequential amendments to give effect to earlier transfers of functions to ensure the legislation reflects current ministerial functions.

Regulation 10 names the Regulations and provides for them to come into force on the day after they are made.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Article 29(2) and (3) of the States of Jersey Law 2005¹, have made the following Regulations –

1 Interpretation

In these Regulations –

“receiving Minister” means a Minister to whom functions are transferred by these Regulations;

“transferring Minister” means a Minister from whom functions are transferred by these Regulations.

2 Changes in description of some Ministers

- (1) The Minister for Economic Development is to be described as the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture.
- (2) The Minister for Education, Sport and Culture is to be described as the Minister for Education.
- (3) The Minister for Planning and Environment is to be described as the Minister for the Environment.
- (4) The Minister for Transport and Technical Services is to be described as the Minister for Infrastructure.
- (5) Part 1 of Schedules 1 and 3 and Schedules 2 and 4 list the enactments that are consequentially amended, so that for the descriptions of Ministers that applied before the coming into force of these Regulations there shall be substituted the descriptions of Ministers that apply as a consequence of this Regulation.
- (6) Part 2 of Schedules 1 and 3 list the Orders in Council that are to be construed so that references to a description of Jersey Minister in any such Order in Council, or in any enactment of the United Kingdom extended by it, that is changed by this Regulation are to be construed as

references to the description of Minister that applies as a consequence of this Regulation.

- (7) In paragraph (6) a reference to a description of Jersey Minister includes a reference to a Committee or a Minister that is already to be construed as referring to such a Minister.
- (8) For standing order 117(1) of the Standing Orders of the States of Jersey there shall be substituted the following paragraph –

“(1) The Ministerial offices are –

Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture

Education

Environment

External Relations

Health and Social Services

Home Affairs

Housing

Infrastructure

Social Security

Treasury and Resources.”.

3 Transfer of functions: Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture to Minister for the Environment

- (1) There shall be transferred to the Minister for the Environment the functions of the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture in respect of fisheries and other aquatic resources.
- (2) In the following enactments for the words “Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture” (as substituted by Regulation 2(5) and Part 1 of Schedule 1) there shall be substituted the words “Minister for the Environment” –
 - (a) Sea Fisheries (Jersey) Law 1994²;
 - (b) Aquatic Resources (Jersey) Law 2014³;
 - (c) Fish Health (Jersey) Regulations 1999⁴.
- (3) In the following Orders in Council, or in any enactment of the United Kingdom extended by them, references that were, by virtue of Regulation 2(6) and Part 2 of Schedule 1, to be construed as referring to the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture are instead to be construed as referring to the Minister for the Environment –
 - (a) Sea Fish (Conservation) (Channel Islands) Order 1981⁵;
 - (b) Sea Fisheries (Channel Islands) Order 1973⁶.

4 Transfer of functions: Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture to Chief Minister

- (1) There shall be transferred to the Chief Minister the functions of the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture in respect of the following matters –
 - (a) the digital sector of the economy (including the grant to Digital Jersey Limited);
 - (b) communications and broadcasting;
 - (c) competition;
 - (d) intellectual property;
 - (e) the Jersey Innovation Fund and the grant to Jersey Finance Limited.
- (2) In the following enactments for the words “Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture” (as substituted by Regulation 2(5) and Part 1 of Schedule 1) there shall be substituted the words “Chief Minister” –
 - (a) Electronic Communications (Jersey) Law 2000⁷;
 - (b) Competition (Jersey) Law 2005⁸;
 - (c) Competition Regulatory Authority (Jersey) Law 2001⁹;
 - (d) Intellectual Property (Unregistered Rights) (Jersey) Law 2011¹⁰;
 - (e) Merchandise Marks (Jersey) Law 1958¹¹;
 - (f) Patents (Jersey) Law 1957¹²;
 - (g) Registered Designs (Jersey) Law 1957¹³;
 - (h) Trade Marks (Jersey) Law 2000¹⁴;
 - (i) Digital Switchover (Disclosure of Information) (Jersey) Law 2010¹⁵;
 - (j) Postal Services (Jersey) Law 2004¹⁶;
 - (k) Radio Equipment (Jersey) Law 1997¹⁷;
 - (l) Telecommunications (Jersey) Law 2002¹⁸;
 - (m) Public Health (Ships) (Jersey) Order 1971¹⁹ (the reference in Article 34 only);
 - (n) Public Health (Aircraft) (Jersey) Order 1971²⁰.
- (3) In the following Orders in Council, or in any enactment of the United Kingdom extended by them, references that were, by virtue of Regulation 2(6) and Part 2 of Schedule 1, to be construed as referring to the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture are instead to be construed as referring to the Chief Minister –
 - (a) Broadcasting Act 1990 (Jersey) (No. 2) Order 1991²¹;
 - (b) Broadcasting (Jersey) Order 2003²²;
 - (c) Communications (Jersey) Order 2003²³;
 - (d) Telecommunication Services (Jersey) Order 1972²⁴;
 - (e) Wireless Telegraphy (Jersey) Order 2006²⁵.

5 Transfer of functions: Minister for Education to Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture

- (1) There shall be transferred to the Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture the functions of the Minister for Education in respect of sport and culture.
- (2) In the Public Records (Jersey) Law 2002²⁶ for the words “Minister for Education” (as substituted by Regulation 2(5) and Schedule 2) there shall be substituted the words “Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture”.

6 Transfer of functions: Minister for Treasury and Resources to Minister for Infrastructure

- (1) There shall be transferred to the Minister for Infrastructure the functions of the Minister for Treasury and Resources in respect of Jersey Property Holdings.
- (2) In standing order 168 of the Standing Orders of the States of Jersey²⁷ for the words “Minister for Treasury and Resources” there shall be substituted the words “Minister for Infrastructure”.

7 Connected rights and liabilities transferred

- (1) All rights enjoyed and liabilities incurred by a transferring Minister in connection with the functions transferred by any of Regulations 3 to 6 shall be transferred to the appropriate receiving Minister and become the rights and liabilities of that receiving Minister.
- (2) A provision of a contract or other instrument that specifies that a right or liability of a transferring Minister is incapable of transfer shall, to the extent that it applies to a right or liability transferred by paragraph (1), be of no effect.
- (3) The operation of paragraph (1) shall not be regarded –
 - (a) as a breach of contract or confidence or otherwise as a civil wrong;
 - (b) as a breach of any contractual provision prohibiting, restricting or regulating the assignment or transfer of rights or liabilities; or
 - (c) as giving rise to any remedy by a party to a contract or other instrument, as an event of default under any contract or other instrument or as causing or permitting the termination of any contract or other instrument, or of any obligation or relationship.

8 Transitional provisions

- (1) A transfer effected by any of Regulations 3 to 6 shall not prejudice the operation of any appointment, approval, authorization, consent, delegation, determination, direction, instruction, requirement or other thing that is, before these Regulations come into force, made, given or done by a transferring Minister in relation to the functions, rights and liabilities so transferred, but such matter shall, if then in force, continue in

force to the like extent and subject to the like provisions as if it had been duly made, given or done by the appropriate receiving Minister.

- (2) Anything commenced, before these Regulations come into force, by or under the authority of a transferring Minister may, so far as it relates to any of the functions, rights and liabilities transferred by Regulations 5 to 10, be carried on and completed by or under the authority of the appropriate receiving Minister.
- (3) Where, at the coming into force of these Regulations, any legal proceeding is pending to which a transferring Minister is a party and the proceeding has reference to any of the functions, rights and liabilities transferred by Regulations 3 to 7, the appropriate receiving Minister shall be substituted in the proceeding for the transferring Minister and the proceeding shall not abate by reason of the substitution.

9 Miscellaneous amendments

- (1) In Article 42(3)(f) of the Motor Traffic (Jersey) Law 1935²⁸ for the words “Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture” (as substituted by Regulation 3(5) and Part 1 of Schedule 1) there shall be substituted the words “Chief Minister”.
- (2) In the definition “Minister” in Regulation 1(1) of the European Communities Legislation (Implementation) (Cattle Identification) (Jersey) Regulations 2002²⁹ for the words “Minister for Economic Development Tourism, Sport and Culture” (as substituted by Regulation 3(5) and Part 1 of Schedule 1) there shall be substituted the words “Minister for the Environment”.

10 Citation

These Regulations may be cited as the States of Jersey (Transfer of Functions No. 8) (Miscellaneous Transfers) (Jersey) Regulations 201- and shall come into force on the day following the day on which they are made.
