DRAFT PUBLIC HOLIDAYS AND BANK HOLIDAYS (JERSEY) ACT 200-

REPORT

Under the Law relating to Public and Bank Holidays in Jersey, Liberation Day on 9th May each year is designated as a public holiday unless it falls on a Sunday. In 2010, 9th May falls on a Sunday.

Given that in 2010, the Island will be celebrating the 65th anniversary of the Liberation from German occupation, it is proposed that we mark this event by declaring Monday 10th May as a public holiday in order that Islanders may enjoy a weekend of celebrations.

Financial and manpower implications

The cost to the public sector would be of the order of £1.5 million, but it should be noted that Liberation Day is normally observed as a public holiday in the Island each year and funded as such from departmental budgets.

Explanatory Note

This Act would appoint Monday 10th May 2010 as a public holiday.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Article 2 of the Public Holidays and Bank Holidays (Jersey) Law 1951¹, have made the following Act –

1 Additional day appointed in 2010

The 10th May 2010 is appointed to be observed as a public holiday.

2 Citation

This Act may be cited as the Public Holidays and Bank Holidays (Jersey) Act 200-.
