Item 6 514/14(8)	It was noted that some information previously requested for the Panel's adviser from the Environment Department had now been received; an update on the historic Mont Mado rubbish tip was still outstanding. The Panel had been directed towards to the Airport Engineers for data on PFOS monitoring and the Scrutiny officer had asked the adviser for guidance on specific details required.	МО

Members discussed information supplied by the Transport and Technical Services Department in lieu of that meeting and agreed a number of questions to be followed up in writing. 	5. La Collette Headland	
514/1(24)	The Panel considered reports recently circulated by the Transport and Technical Services Department to potential stakeholders, describing a scheme for the disposal of ash from the new Energy from Waste Plant at La Collette into a raised artificial headland at the reclamation site.  Members expressed serious concerns about the scale of the	

proposed scheme, the timescale for its completion and possible risks for the environment. The Scrutiny officer was requested to draft a letter to the Minister for Transport and Technical Services detailing the Panel's concerns.	MO
6. Draft Shipping (Maritime Pollution) Regulations	
The Panel received copies of the draft regulations which had been forwarded with a request for attention by the Economic Affairs Scrutiny Panel. It was understood that the Economic Affairs Panel had previously considered reviewing the legislation but had decided that that the Environment Panel might wish to do so instead. Members agreed that as the legislation referred specifically to the responsibilities of the Minister for Economic Development, this was not within its remit and it was a matter for the Economic Affairs Panel to decide whether or not to undertake a review.
