“Given that a justification for allowing those granted 1(1)(k) status to circumvent the housing qualification period which applies to others is their 'high value' to the community, will the Minister clarify whether the wealth accumulated by any current 1(1)(k) resident has been linked to previous mercenary activity or the supply of arms and whether background checks are carried out to ensure that such residents are not welcomed?”
3. Senator S.C. Ferguson will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“How long will it be before Jersey follows the UK's commitment to transparency and organisation charts by showing the names, job title and salary for all senior civil servants at director level and above, as well as the job title of all senior civil servants at deputy director level, along with the number of staff in their team and their grades?”
4. Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“What lessons, if any, does the Chief Minister think can be learnt from the current Irish crisis and what impact or implications does he see this crisis having on Jersey?”
5. Deputy R.G. Le Hérissier of St Saviour will ask the following question of the Minister for Health and Social Services –

“Why was the expertise not available internally to conduct the study into Jersey's Health and Social Services?”

6. Deputy J.M. Maçon of St. Saviour will ask the following question of the Chairman of the Privileges and Procedures Committee –

“With the move to a single day election, what preparations, if any, has the Committee decided to make in order to promote and educate the electorate on the new system when voting?”

7. Deputy A.E. Jeune of St. Brelade will ask the following question of the Minister for Health and Social Services –

“Would the Minister advise Members which budget has funded the approximate sum of £800,000 for a review of services, and when this sum was allocated and provide members at today's sitting with a copy of the terms of reference for the project, with the agreed timescale for completion?”

8. Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Treasury and Resources –

“Following the EU Code group's decision that Jersey's deemed distribution system for zero/ten is in conflict with the EU Code on Business Taxation, what consideration, if any, has the Minister given to the removal of deemed distribution for locally owned companies, what is the estimated tax loss each year, how is business tax avoidance to be stopped and how will any loss of revenue resulting from this change be made good?”

9. The Deputy of St. Martin will ask the following question of the Chief Minister –

“Given that the explanations given as to why and when the Napier Terms of Reference were altered refer to decisions taken after R.39/2010 was presented to the States, will the Chief Minister inform Members when this was done and who was party to the decision and explain why he and the Deputy of St. Martin were not party to the discussions?”

10. The Deputy of St. John will ask the following question of the Minister for Economic Development –

“Can the Minister explain how, with payments of £650 for the Chair and £450 per day per member for up to 40 days per annum (equating to a minimum of £26,000 per year) these sums for membership of the Harbours and Airport Shadow Board can be considered to be an ‘Honorarium’ as stated in the advertisement for the positions?”

11. Deputy P.V.F. Le Claire of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Planning and Environment –

“Further to the response given on 16th November 2010 regarding the treatment and management of ash water, is the Minister now able to furnish members with a full management report and is he also able to provide members with copies of the discharge permits and certificates relating to the treatment and subsequent release of treated waters into the marine environment in St Aubin's Bay?”

12. The Deputy of St. Mary will ask the following question of the Minister for Treasury and Resources –

“With reference to page 60 of the budget report, can the Minister tell members the total tax yield from non-resident landlords with rental income arising in Jersey, the number of landlords to whom this applies and the estimated yield from the proposal to ensure that this tax is paid by

those non-resident landlords who do not pay at present?”

13. Deputy S. Pitman of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

“Following the naming of a senior Civil Servant from the Education, Sport and Culture Department in court by alleged victims within the current historic abuse proceedings, will the Minister give members and parents assurances that the matter has been fully investigated by his department?”

14. Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Health and Social Services –

“What consideration, if any, has the Minister given to either the introduction of ‘user-pays’ charges or to outsourcing patient transport activities as part of the drive to eliminate non-core services in line with the CSR stage 2 measures?”

15. Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Treasury and Resources –

“Following the Minister’s Press Statement on 23rd November 2010, will he now publish to members all papers and correspondence between ECOFIN (and those acting on its behalf) and the authorities in Jersey in the interests of openness and transparency, and to enable members to determine for themselves on the basis of the evidence whether Jersey is compliant with the EU Code or not?”

16. Deputy R.G. Le Hérisier of St Saviour will ask the following question of the Minister for Economic Development –

“What action, if any, is the Minister able to take to stop telephone ‘scams’?”

17. Deputy K.C. Lewis of St. Saviour will ask the following question of the Minister for Economic Development –

“With 1290 people in Jersey registered as unemployed, will the Minister be reducing the number of licences issued to companies to employ non locals and, if not, why not?”

18. Deputy S. Pitman of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Treasury and Resources –

“Will the Minister outline when the Island will receive a final, categorical answer to the question of whether or not all aspects of the Zero-Ten taxation policy are EU compliant and the full reasons underlying this?”

19. Deputy P.V.F. Le Claire of St. Helier will ask the following question of the Minister for Treasury and Resources –

“Following the Minister’s recent press release concerning Zero-Ten, in which he advised that the consensus of the EU Code Group was that the present Zero-Ten regime was ‘harmful’, what options, if any, are under consideration as a viable alternative?”

20. The Deputy of St. John will ask the following question of the Minister for Transport and Technical Services –

“Has any action been taken by the Transport and Technical Services Department and the contractor to rectify the poor quality asphalt work on Queen’s Road and on the footpath

between Rue du Galet and First Tower and, if so, would he detail the cost of this work and the amount paid to the contractor and advise whether the works were undertaken by the same contractor as Victoria Avenue?”

“Further to the response given on 20th October 2009, when I asked the Chief Minister whether the introduction of the Deemed Distributed measures which discriminate against Jersey-owned Jersey companies in direct contravention of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development’s directive was justified, is he still able to justify the measures in light of the recent announcement by the EU code group?”

Explanatory Note regarding subordinate legislation tabled at this meeting.

R&O.111/2010.

This Order increases a number of fees relating to sea fisheries and introduces a fee for the application of a sea fisheries licence.

The fee for the grant of a fishing boat licence is increased from £85.60 to £92.00, an increase of 7.5%. The fee was last increased on 1st January 2008

The fee for a permit for the taking of scallops in unlimited quantities is increased from £75.30 to £80.95, an increase of 7.5%. The fee was last increased on 1st January 2008

The fee for a permit for the taking of a maximum of 24 scallops a day is increased from £16.70 to £16.90, an increase of 1.43%. This fee was last increased on 1st March 2010

The annual fee for the grant or renewal of a sea fisheries licence is increased from £155.80 to £167.50 and the annual charge per hectare of the area covered by such a licence is increased from £23.60 to £25.40. Both these charges represent an increase of 7.5% and were last increased on 1st January 2008. Such charges were previously determined by the Minister for Economic Development administratively, without the need for an Order, under the Sea Fisheries (Establishment and Regulation of Fisheries) (Jersey) Regulations 1998. These Regulations have been revoked and replaced by the Sea Fisheries (Fisheries) (Jersey) Regulations 2010, in force from 27th April 2010 which requires such fees to be prescribed by Order.

This Order introduces a fee of £167.50 for the application of a sea fisheries licence under the Sea Fisheries (Fisheries) (Jersey) Regulations 2010.

The Sea Fisheries (Fees) (Jersey) Order 2007 is revoked.

The Order was made on 16th November 2010 and the increases in fees under this Order take effect on 1st January 2011

R&O.113/2010.

This Order amends two exemptions from registration for carrying on trust company business under the Financial Services (Jersey) Law 1998.

Article 1 of this Order revises paragraph 13 of the Schedule to the Financial Services (Trust Company Business (Exemptions)) (Jersey) Order 2000 by including a new sub-paragraph (2) setting out an exemption in relation to acting as a company director.

The effect is that an individual may act as director of up to 6 companies without triggering the requirement to register under the Financial Services (Jersey) Law 1998.

The revised paragraph 13 also (in new sub-paragraph (3)) makes it clear that when working out an individual's number of directorships, no account is to be taken of any directorship in relation to which some other exemption applies under the trust company business exemptions under the Financial Services (Jersey) Law 1998.

Article 2 of this Order amends the Schedule to the Financial Services (Trust Company Business (Exemptions No. 4)) (Jersey) Order 2001, making it clear that both prerequisites for an exemption for connected persons must be satisfied.

Article 3 sets out the name of this Order and specifies when it is to come into force.

The Order was made on 17th November 2010 and comes into force in accordance with Article 3.

R&O.114/2010.

This Order adds 9 car parks to the lists of public parking places subject to time restrictions. The places are in the parishes of St. Brelade, St. Clement, St. Helier, St. Martin and St. Saviour.

Article 1 defines the expression “principal Order” to mean the Road Traffic (Public Parking Places) (Jersey) Order 2006.

Article 2 amends, in the definition of “controlling body”, the list of public parking places under the control of the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture. A controlling body has general supervision of public parking places and may impose conditions on their use.

Article 3 assigns the additional parking places to their parish lists.

Article 4 assigns different time restrictions to those parking places.

Article 5 names the Order.

Article 6 brings the Order into force 7 days after it is made.

The Order was made on 20th November 2010 and came into force on 27th November 2010.

R&O.115/2010.

These Rules apply to appeals to the Court of Appeal under *Articles 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25* and *26* of the Sex Offenders (Jersey) Law 2010 (“the Law”).

The main purpose of the Law is to require people who have been convicted (before or after the Law comes into force) of certain sexual offences to keep the police informed of their whereabouts while they are in Jersey. It also empowers the courts to make orders restricting the activities of people who may be sexual predators or who may sexually exploit children and vulnerable persons. It also requires the Chief Police Officer and certain Ministers to enter into agreements setting out general arrangements to be put into effect to assess and manage persons who pose a risk of sexual harm.

The Articles referred to above confer certain rights of appeal from the Royal Court to the Court of Appeal. Such appeals are (by virtue of *Article 18*) by way of a review. On such an appeal, the Court of Appeal—

- (a) may make any order it considers necessary to give effect to its determination of the appeal; and
- (b) may make any incidental or consequential order as appears to it to be just.

In relation to each of the rights of appeal conferred:

Article 19 provides for appeals where the Royal Court has certified or has refused to certify an offence as sexually aggravated or that an offence involved the use or the threat of the use of violence against a person or property.

Article 20 provides for appeals where the Royal Court has specified a period that must expire before a person subject to notification requirements may make an application for an order that he or she should no longer be subject to those requirements.

Article 21 provides for appeals where the Royal Court has decided to make or not to make an order that a person should no longer be subject to notification requirements; or that a person be made subject to notification requirements in respect of an offence committed before the Law came into force.

Article 22 provides for appeals where the Royal Court has made or refused to make a restraining order under the Law. A restraining order may be made against a person who has committed certain sexual offences in certain circumstances (see *Article 10*) where the court is satisfied on the balance of probabilities, on the application of the Attorney General, that the person poses a threat of serious sexual harm to the public or any particular person or persons. The court may make such order in respect of the offender as it is satisfied is necessary to protect the public or any particular person or persons from serious sexual harm from the offender.

Article 23 provides for appeals where the Royal Court has made or refused to make a child protection order under the Law. The Attorney General may apply to the Royal Court (under *Article 11*) for a child protection order in

respect of a person aged 15 or over (“the defendant”) who resides in Jersey; or who the Attorney General believes is in, or is intending to come to, Jersey. The Court may make the order if satisfied on the balance of probabilities that the defendant has engaged in certain sexual activities and it is necessary to make the order to protect children generally or any child from harm from the defendant. A child protection order prohibits the defendant from doing anything described in the order; and has effect for a fixed period (not less than 2 years) specified in the order or until further order.

Article 24 provides for appeals where the Royal Court has made or refused to make a travel order under the Law. The Attorney General may apply to the Royal Court (under *Article 12*) for a travel order in respect of a person subject to notification requirements (“the notifier”). The Court may make the order if satisfied on the balance of probabilities that the notifier’s acts and behaviour make it necessary to make such an order for the purpose of protecting children generally or any child from serious sexual harm from the notifier outside Jersey. The order may prohibit the notifier from travelling to places outside Jersey either generally, or as named or described in the order.

Article 25 provides for appeals where the Royal Court has made or refused to make an order imposing notification requirements on a person in respect of a conviction before the commencement of the Law of a relevant sexual offence.

Article 26 provides for appeals where the Royal Court has made or refused to make an order imposing or continuing notification requirements on a person who, outside Jersey, has been convicted of an offence which, if committed in Jersey, would have constituted a sexual offence to which the Law applies.

These Rules of Court consist of 3 *Parts*, 12 *Rules* and 1 *Schedule*.

Part 1 consists of *Rule 1* only, relating to interpretation; but the definitions of “*appeal*”, “*appellant*” and “*respondent*” are referable to *Rule 2(2)*

Part 2 consists of *Rules 2* to *7* relating to appeals under *Articles 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25* and *26* of the Law (a “*appeal*” means any such appeal).

Rule 2 deals with the application of the Rules. The terms “*appellant*” and “*respondent*” are defined.

Rule 3 makes provision for the commencement of an appeal by giving notice of appeal (in the appropriate Form specified in the Schedule) not later than 14 days after the day on which the decision appealed against is given. The notice must be sent to the Greffier; and the Greffier must send a copy of the notice of appeal to the respondent.

Rule 4 provides for service of a respondent’s notice and requires such a notice to be lodged if the respondent wants to make representations to the Court of Appeal; or if the Court of Appeal so directs. There is a 7 day period within which to file a respondent’s notice. The Greffier must send a copy of the respondent’s notice to the appellant.

Rule 5 provides that a notice of appeal or respondent’s notice may be amended with leave of the Court.

Rule 6 provides for the Greffier to set the appeal down on the list of appeals when the respondent’s notice has been served, or the time limited for serving it has expired; and for the Greffier shall to give notice that the appeal has been set down; and to give directions to the parties to progress the appeal.

Rule 7 requires that a date be fixed for the hearing of the appeal as soon as is convenient to the Court, and the Greffier is required to give notice thereof to the parties.

Part 3 consists of *Rules 8* to *12* making general provisions.

Rule 8 makes provision as to parties in custody, and their right to be present on the hearing of the appeal; and as to their entitlement to be present at proceedings preliminary or incidental to the appeal if given leave by the Court to be present, or if not legally represented.

Rule 9 relates to the power of the Court in relation to stay of execution or of proceedings under the decision appealed from; and the effect of an appeal on the order of the court below.

Rule 10 empowers a judge of the Court to extend or shorten time within which anything is required to be done in connection with an appeal.

Rule 11 enables an appellant to abandon an appeal by written notice to the Greffier, but without affecting the Court’s discretion as to costs.

Rule 12 is the customary citation and commencement provision.

The *Schedule* contains 8 Forms of Notice of Appeal under the respective *Articles* of the Law to which the *Rules*

relate (see above in relation to *Rule 3*).

The Rules were made by the Court of Appeal on 22nd November 2010 and will come into force on the day that the States by Act appoint for the coming into force of the Sex Offenders (Jersey) Law 2010.

5. The Minister for Education, Sport and Culture will table an answer to the following question asked by Senator J.L Perchard –

“Will the Minister outline his options and proposals to deliver the Education, Sport and Culture Department’s 10% CSR savings should the States decide in 2011 that the grants to fee-paying/private schools are not to be reduced by more than a total of 10% as required by the CSR savings?”

6. The Minister for Education, Sport and Culture will table an answer to the following question asked by Senator J.L. Perchard –

“When was it first agreed that a Green Paper on the future of education should be produced, who is undertaking the work, what are their terms of reference and when does the Minister expect to publish the results?”

7. The Minister for Housing will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy P.V.F. Le Claire of St. Helier –

“Can the Minister provide Members with the current States waiting list and explain why there appears to be no continuous record of the lists published over the last 10 years on the States website?”

8. The Chief Minister will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy P.V.F. Le Claire of St. Helier –

“Will the Chief Minister be publishing progress against Strategic Plan initiatives again in January 2011 and, if not, why not?”

9. The Minister for Home Affairs will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy R.G. Le Hérissier of St. Saviour –

“Will the Minister be bringing proposals to the Assembly in response to the Scrutiny Report on the Role of the Prison Board of Visitors presented to the Assembly on 18th August 2009 (SR7/2009), and if so, when?”

10. The Minister for Transport and Technical Services will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy R.G. Le Hérissier of St. Saviour –

“Will the Minister be proposing that the school bus service be more fully integrated with the scheduled service given the call for more public transport at peak times?”

11. The Minister for Home Affairs will table an answer to the following question asked by the Deputy of St. John –

“Will the Minister advise whether he is aware that cloning of vehicle number plates is happening in Jersey, and, if so, is he able to provide members with details of the number of reported offences over the last 3 years; the number of prosecutions, if any; and the number of offences dealt with at Parish Hall level?”

Where cloning has taken place and motoring/parking offences have been subsequently committed, is this recorded on the record sheet of the registered owner and, if so, what action is taken to clear the name of the legal owner once it is established that the offence was committed by a third party?”

12. The Chief Minister will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier–

“Will the Chief Minister inform members whether he has received the results of the EU Code of Conduct group investigation into the Island’s zero/ten tax regime, either directly or through the UK government, and if so, can he confirm whether zero/ten has failed the first three elements assessed under paragraph B of the EU Code on Business Taxation and will he make the results public, along with his response to the findings and if not, will he state when he expects to do so?”

13. The Minister for Housing will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister provide evidence to substantiate his claims made at the Health, Social Security and Housing Scrutiny public hearing on 10th November 2010, that the replacement of old centralised wet heating systems with new individual electric heating systems in several estates (Clos Gosset, Clos de Roncier, Oak Tree Gardens) has reduced heating bills for tenants?”

14. The Minister for Housing will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister inform members whether the CSR cuts to his budget have delayed the programme of refurbishment and maintenance of States rental housing estates and, if so, will he detail the extent of these delays?

Will he further inform members of the extent of the work required to bring Pomme d’Or Farm up to modern standards and state what delays, if any, have occurred with this project?

Will he state the extent to which his programme of work is dependant on the sale of housing stock and inform members what targets have been set and what sales have been achieved over the past 2 years, along with his targets for sales for 2012 and 2013?”

15. The Minister for Health and Social Services will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier –

“Can the Minister provide evidence to support her statement at the Health, Social Security and Housing Scrutiny hearing on 8th November 2010, that there has been significant growth in non-urgent attendances at the Hospital’s Accident and Emergency department, particularly in relation to the period from 2006 to 2009 following the introduction of Income Support and the removal of free GP attendances associated with HIE?”

16. The Minister for Treasury and Resources will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier –

“What research, if any, has the Minister undertaken into the impact of a 2% increase in GST on the economy, particularly on the retail and hospitality sectors? If none, what evidence does he have that removing some £30 million from the economy in this way will not be harmful?”

17. The Minister for Treasury and Resources will table an answer to the following question asked by the Deputy of St. Peter –

“What are the total budgeted amounts for 2011, 2012 and 2013 in respect of the central reserves, departmental reserves (by individual departments) and any other contingency or provision included within the 2011, 2012 and 2013 expenditure figures?

What are the cash balances for the Consolidated Fund, Stabilisation Fund and any other fund (or cash equivalent) as at the 30th September 2010 and projected for 31st December 2010?”

What are the values of the Strategic Reserve and any other reserves as at 30th September 2010 and projected for 31st December 2010?”

18. The Minister for Treasury and Resources will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy M. Higgins of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister advise members what the trend rate of economic growth for the Jersey economy has been over the last ten years and detail how he expects the Jersey economy to perform over the next three years against this trend rate?”

19. The Minister for Economic Development will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister inform members of the total amount (in pounds sterling) and the number of loan guarantees and other financial assistance/guarantees provided to the local business community by the Economic Development Department over the last three years, breaking the information down to sector, type of assistance, amounts, duration of loans or loan guarantees and (without naming the individuals and businesses concerned), of the number of such guarantees distributed to particular individuals and businesses?”

20. The Minister for Economic Development will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister provide members with the figures (as supplied by the Jersey Financial Services Commission to the International Monetary Fund) relating to the level of upstreaming of deposits in sterling and foreign currency from banks resident in Jersey to their offices in London and to the money markets in London on a monthly basis from January 2007 to the present day?”

21. The Minister for Treasury and Resources will table an answer to the following question asked by Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier -

“Does the Minister propose bringing in any additional economic data gathering measures such as the level of lending by banks and other finance providers within the Island (breaking the data down in mortgage lending, hire purchase, loans to small and medium enterprises and so on) and, if so, what data sets are under consideration and when will they be introduced and, if not, why not?”

Does the Minister consider up to date and comprehensive data important for policy formation and measuring the state of the Jersey economy?”

- (b) what has happened to each property? (has it been sold, leased, rented or otherwise in use?)
- (c) if sold, rented or leased in a way which in itself does not benefit the beneficiaries in accordance with the terms of the Will, who administers the revenue, how is that administration organised, and who benefits from the revenue in each case?
- (d) if it is being used in a way which in itself does benefit the beneficiaries, on what basis is this being done?
- (e) what discussions, if any, have been held with the executors of the Will?”

“Following his answer to written question No. 5825 on 16th November 2010, in order to understand the rationale for these voluntary redundancy requests being allowed, can the Chief Minister give members an

25. The Minister for Treasury and Resources will table an answer to the following question asked by the Deputy of St. Mary –

“Further to page 60 of the budget report in which the Minister writes that “certain non-resident landlords with rental income arising in Jersey are not fulfilling their tax obligations”, can he inform members:

- (a) to how many landlords this refers?
- (b) to how many tenancies this refers?
- (c) what is the likely yield of closing this loophole?”

26. The Minister for Treasury and Resources will table an answer to the following question asked by the Deputy of St. Mary –
