REPORT

The Chief Minister is proposing that the States agree to make Friday 29th April 2011 a public holiday in recognition of the forthcoming marriage of H.R.H. Prince William and Miss Catherine Middleton.

The Chief Minister considers that Islanders should be enabled to celebrate the royal event in the same way as citizens in the United Kingdom.

Financial and manpower implications

The cost of one day's leave for all public employees is estimated at approximately £1.5 million.

Explanatory Note

This draft Act would make Friday 29th April 2011 a public holiday.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Article 2 of the Public Holidays and Bank Holidays (Jersey) Law 1951¹, have made the following Act –

1 Public Holidays and Bank Holidays (Jersey) Act 2010 amended

In Part 2 of the Schedule to the Public Holidays and Bank Holidays (Jersey) Act 2010² before paragraph 1 there shall be inserted the following paragraph –

"A1 2011: Royal wedding

Friday 29th April 2011 is to be observed as a public holiday.".

2 Citation and commencement

This Act may be cited as the Public Holidays and Bank Holidays (Amendment) (Jersey) Act 201- and shall come into force on the day after the day it is made.
