I am particularly interested in item 1a) as I have been conducting my own enquiries since 2004 into the role of the officers involved in the application for the construction of the structure at Mont Orgueil Castle known as the tudor hall. I have directed my enquiries towards the Royal Commission of Wales whose former secretary Mr Peter White worked closely with local planning officers and apparently on his sudden retirement last May removed documentation from the offices of the Commission which in my opinion is public property under the terms of the U.K. Freedom of Information Act.
