The Panel recalled its previous agreement to spend the time required to deal with some smaller outstanding matters on its Work Programme such as the Importation of Bovine Semen, Overseas Aid and International Relations and that the 'Whistle blowing' review would be dealt with at a later time than had initially been foreseen (potentially the end of November 2009). The Panel therefore noted that its current commitments would not allow a review relating to Human Resources or the States Employment Board to start until late November 2009 and that careful consideration would need to be given at that time to balancing the Work Programme between that review, the 'Whistle blowing' review and the review of Migration legislation which was due to begin again in earnest at that time.
