STATES OF JERSEY LAW 2005: DELEGATION OF FUNCTIONS – SOCIAL SECURITY – APPOINTMENT OF DETERMINING OFFICERS

REPORT

On 18th May 2010, the Minister for Social Security made a Ministerial Decision delegating certain of his functions under Article 28 of the States of Jersey Law 2005 (MD-S-2010-0020, available at www.gov.je).

The terms of the delegations, and the legislation under which those delegations were made, were recorded in a Report attached to the Ministerial Decision, as shown below –

The Minister, in pursuance of Article 28 of the States of Jersey Law 2005, is asked to give authority to the Controller of the Social Security Department and in his absence the Operations Director, the following delegated powers with immediate effect.

Legislation:	Article 33 of the Social Security (Jersey) Law 1974
Function delegated:	The power to appoint Determining Officers for the determination of any question arising under or in connection with this Law, including any claim for benefit.
Legislation:	Article 9 of the Income Support (Jersey) Law 2007
Function delegated:	The power to appoint Determining Officers for the determination of any claim under this Law.
Legislation:	Article 8 of the Invalid Care Allowance (Jersey) Law 1978
Function delegated:	The power to appoint Determining Officers for the determination of any claim under this Law.
Legislation:	Article 28 of the Health Insurance (Jersey) Law 1967
Function delegated:	The power to appoint Determining Officers for the determination of any question arising under or in connection with this Law, including any claim for benefit.
