### Report

This amendment is to the charges made for leaving goods in the harbour beyond a free period specified in the Harbour Regulations. The purpose is to allow sufficient time for cargo to be handled and despatched, but to discourage the harbour area being used as a store area for goods. With the limitations on space within the Island, it is an essential tool to maintain the movement of goods through the harbour and is fully supported by the Port Users.

These charges cannot be directly related to cost but it has traditionally been related to the general percentage increase in commercial harbour fees. There is some basis for this as companies will bulk order when they have insufficient space and balance the charges by advantages of lower prices or contract time penalties. Most charges therefore apply not to careless collection, but to commercial decisions and thus it is important to keep pace with commercial charges and a 2.5% increase is proposed.

There are no additional manpower implications for the States arising from this amendment to the charges.

# **Explanatory Note**

These Regulations would increase the charges that may be levied for flats, trailers, containers, equipment, vehicles and other goods that remain on a harbour in excess of the periods specified in Part 1 of the First Schedule to the Harbours (Jersey) Regulations 1962, as amended.

The effect of the amendment would be to increase the unit charges by 2.5% to£4.05 per metre.

The amending Regulations would come into force on 1st January 2003.

**THE STATES,** in pursuance of Article 4 of the Harbours (Administration) (Jersey) Law 1961, as amended, have made the following Regulations -

- 1. For the First Schedule to the Harbours (Jersey) Regulations 1962, as amended, [3] there shall be substituted the schedule set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.
  - 2. The Harbours (Amendment No. 33) (Jersey) Regulations 200<sup>[4]</sup> shall be repealed.
- **3.** These Regulations may be cited as the Harbours (Amendment No. 35) (Jersey) Regulations 200 and shall come into force on 1st January 2003.
