	The Panel agreed to maintain its proposed amendment to the Minister's proposition stipulating that Tasers would only be used in situations where the Command Officer was satisfied, on reasonable grounds, that	
	(a) no lesser force option had been, or will be, effective in eliminating the risk of bodily harm; and(b) de-escalation and/or crisis intervention techniques had not been or would not be effective in eliminating the risk of bodily harm. The Panel	

	agreed that it was important that these conditions should be stated	
	explicitly in then proposition.	
	The Panel agreed further detailed comments on the draft report and requested that the letter be forwarded to the Minister accordingly.
