Policy option E 2 Identifying key habitats within an Environment Plan

"The Environmental Plan to identify and provide recommendations for the maintenance and enhancement of biological diversity both within and between habitats on all land covered by the Plan. This will include areas of woodland, wet meadow and other permanent grassland, ponds, marsh, dunes, heathland, cliff slope and boundary features (banks, hedges and ditches)."

Identifying important woodland and hedge habitats is useful but funds need to be made available by the way of grants to facilitate the necessary work to improve and enhance such habitats.

Hedge planting should be encouraged to maintain our traditional and historical divisions between fields. This, will retain the rural character of the countryside in the form of a "patchwork" of small fields, in scale with the size of the Island.

Hedges help to retain and define field boundaries by preventing trampling by livestock and erosion by farming practices and mechanical implements.
