**R&O.31/2020.**

Medical Practitioners (Registration) (General Provisions) (Covid-19 – Temporary Amendments) (Jersey) Order 2020.

This Order temporarily amends the Medical Practitioners (Registration) (General Provisions) (Jersey) Order 2014 during an emergency relating to the Covid-19 outbreak in Jersey. The provision requiring an application for registration as a medical practitioner to contain certain particulars and documents does not apply if the Commission does not consider it reasonable to require them. The registration requirements are also relaxed to allow for the registration of medical practitioners in Jersey who have been registered in the United Kingdom under section 18A of the Medical Act 1983 (which allows for registration during emergencies).

The amendment expires on 30th September 2020.

The Order was made on 25th March 2020 and came into force on 26th March 2020.
